

# Dulles Restates American Stand On Red China

San Francisco (NC) — Secretary of State John Foster Dulles has forcefully restated United States policy to abstain from commercial, cultural, and diplomatic ties with Communist China.

Mr. Dulles asserted that "it would be folly for us to establish relations with the Chinese communists which would enhance their ability to hurt us and our friends." He said Communist China's "foreign policies are hostile to us and our Asian allies."

In a speech to a Latin American convention here, he emphasized the role of the United States as a leader in the free world fight to oppose communism.

The firm anti-communist foreign policy of the United States, said Mr. Dulles, serves as an example and encouragement to free nations, particularly in Asia and the Pacific.

"The United States exports an influence in the world today," said the Secretary of State, "and only because it is naturally powerful, but because we stand for peace, for national independence, and for personal liberty."

"Many free nations seek to coordinate their foreign policies with ours. And such coordination is indeed indispensable if the free world is to have the cohesion needed to make it safe."

"But United States policies will never serve as a rallying point for free peoples if the impression is created that our policies are subject to change to meet communist wishes for no reason other than that communism itself does not want to change. If communism is stubborn for the wrong, let us be steadfast for the right," Mr. Dulles declared.

HE CHARGED that the present Communist party in China "came into power by violence and, so far, has lived by violence." He said that the regime's expansionist and anti-American policies are clear, and cited as examples the Korean and the Indochinese wars, the forcible annexation of Tibet, the fomentation of Huk rebellions in the Philippines, and communist revolts in Malaya.

Red China, he said, "is bitterly hateful of the United States, which it considers its principal obstacle in the path of conquest."

Mr. Dulles explained there had been substantial reasons for United States recognition of the Soviet Union in 1933, reasons which do not exist for the recognition of Red China. He noted, however, that "we would not have accorded recognition to the Soviet Union even in 1933 had there been clear warning that the Soviet promises given in that connection would be totally unreliable."

"In the case of Communist China, we are forewarned," he added. "That regime fails to pass even those tests which, after sixteen years following the Russian revolution, the Soviet regime seemed to pass."

MR. DULLES cited as evidence of Red China's bad faith its record of armed aggression, its declared intention to use force to capture Formosa if necessary, its violations of the Korean and Indochinese armistices, its indecent treatment of, and failure to release, Americans imprisoned in China, and its "clash everywhere" with American policy.

Recognition of Red China, Mr. Dulles said, probably would lead to the entry of that country into the United Nations. There its veto power, coupled with that of the Soviet Union, "would impinge

In the United Nations the seeds of its own destruction!

MR. DULLES rejected commercial and cultural ties with the communist Chinese, "the former because it would build up China's military potential, a cultural exchange program would be initiated by China's Asiatic neighbors, said Mr. Dulles, bringing about a heightening of subversive activities in those free countries."

Mr. Dulles pointed out that despite "basic power rivalries" between China and Russia, it would be a mistake to strengthen China in hopes of bringing about a break between the two countries.
