

Dental Degree For T. R. Curran, Award Winner

Thomas Raphael Curran received his Doctor of Dental Surgery degree from Georgetown University School of Dentistry in Washington, D. C., in June. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Florence A. Curran of 357 Fairham St. in Elmira.

At graduation exercises Dr. Curran received the Alpha Omega Women's Auxiliary Award for excellence in dental research and the G. V. Mosby Scholarship Book Award for scholastic achievement.

Last year he was awarded a U. S. Public Health Fellowship which enabled him to undertake a special research project in anatomy. In senior year he received the Psi Omega Fraternity Achievement Award as its outstanding member.

KNOWN BY his fellow students as "the engineer of activities," Dr. Curran was elected president of the Dean Cogan Dental Society and of the Sodality, co-editor of the Apollonian yearbook, treasurer of Psi Omega, Student Council representative and Communion Breakfast chairman. In his spare time he worked with the Student Health Service of the University.

Prior to postgraduate studies in dentistry at New York University, he will specialize in oral surgery during his internship at Bellevue Hospital in New York.
