Our Lady Of Mount Carmel

The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel which is celebrated on Tuesday of next week, July 16, is an important and joyous one in our Church calendar. In 1251 the Blessed Mother appeared to St. Simon St. Ives, the Prior General of the Carmelite Order.

Mrs. Snyder, holding in her hand the Brown Scapular, Our Lady said: "Receive, my beloved son, this habit; whosoever dies clothed in this shall not suffer eternal fire."

As Father Albert Dolan, O. C. M., in an introduction to his booklet Scapular Facts points out, "Many Catholics come in time to forget what they learned in their childhood about Mary's Scapular." But we should all wear the Scapular and encourage others to do likewise.

THE BOOKLET entitled The Scapular Devotion reminds us that in the years following the gift of the Brown Scapular, the promise of Our Lady, called the Scapular Promise, was studied and found theologically sound; questioned and was confirmed by miracles so numerous that Blessed Claude de la Colombiere, S.J., declared "No devotion has been confirmed with miracles more numerous and authentic."

Acknowledging my information as being from the aforementioned books on the Scapular I shall dispense with quotation marks with the understanding that this material is all taken from these sources.

THE PRIME reward of the Scapular devotion is the assurance of salvation granted by Our Lady in the already quoted promise, "Whosoever dies clothed in this (Scapular) shall not suffer eternal fire."

For this reward two conditions must be fulfilled: 1. One must be lawfully enrolled in the Scapular Confraternity; 2. one must be wearing the Scapular at the moment of death.

A second great reward attached to the Scapular is the Sabbath, enabling the Scapular wearer, by the fulfillment of two conditions in addition to the wearing of the Scapular, to assure his liberation from Purgatory by the first Saturday after death.

IN ADDITION to the wearing of the Scapular these other conditions are: 1. The observance of chastity, according to one's state of life; and 2. the recitation of the Office of Our Lady.

Regarding the third condition (the recitation of the Office of Our Lady) five points are to be

noted: 1. This office must be said every day, and must be recited in accordance with the rubrics of the Roman rite unless one enjoys the privilege of any other rite approved by the Church; 2. this office consists of one nocturne with Lauds and the rest of the Canonical Hours; 3. in the private recitation of the Office, one may use a vernacular language; (In our case, English) 4. those bound to the daily recitation of the Canonical Hours satisfy this condition through the normal daily Office;

5. Those who cannot read may satisfy this condition by observing the fast days of the Church and abstaining from flesh meat on Wednesdays and Saturdays. (In this event wherever the Church dispenses with ecclesiastical fasts, the members of the Scapular Confraternity may use this dispensation.)

This third condition of the privilege, the recitation of the Office may be commuted. All confessors have the faculty of commuting the abstinence on Wednesdays and Saturdays into any other pious work (although the computation is usually to Seven Paters, Aves and Glorias.) Carmelite priests and those who have received a special faculty may commute the Little Office.

It should be noted that this latter faculty is not included in the faculty itself to bless and enroll in the Scapular, but must be used both inside and outside the confessional.

Confidence Privilege Asked For Clergy

Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — A bill was introduced in Congress to exempt ministers, priests and rabbis from being compelled to testify in District of Columbia courts concerning information received in their capacity as spiritual advisers without the consent of the communicant.

Rep. DeWitt S. Hyde (R.Md.) said he introduced the measure because of a recent court case in which a minister was required to testify on a confidential communication.

The congressman, who represents a suburban Maryland district, said that the bill would give Washington clergymen the same right of privileged communications now recognized by law in most states.

At present, only physicians have the right to keep confidential matters which they learn in their professional capacity under the court code of the District of Columbia.

"The ability of ministers of religion to be of assistance to the people who come to them for help or spiritual guidance will be seriously hampered without this exemption," Mr. Hyde said.

"In my three years of pastoral life, I have been accustomed to move about in the towns (in the Liverpool diocese) where one-third of the population is Catholic. It is confidently asserted that over half the population is Catholic. The same proportion is found in new housing estates in that part of England."
