

## How to Judge a Nursing Home

1. How does the neighborhood look? Is there a place to sit outdoors?
2. Is the home covered by Hospital Trained Staff around the clock?
3. How many men and women are on the staff? What training have they had? Is there one employee for every five patients?
4. Does each bedroom contain a bedside table, lamp, easy chair, drawer space, closet, buzzer beside the bed? Are residents permitted personal possessions?
5. Are the bath facilities adequate? Are there non-slip materials on bathroom floors and stairways, handrails beside tubs and showers?
6. Is there an automatic fire alarm, extinguishers?
7. Are patients neatly dressed? What kind of expression do you see on their faces? Do they participate in any activities? How do they spend an average day? Are the ambulatory patients separated from the bed-ridden?
8. How do the menus compare with what your parent has been eating? What's the kitchen like? Is tray service available for bed patients?
9. Can patients have personal physicians?
10. What are the rules of admission, visiting, delivery and dispatch of mail? What is the basic cost?

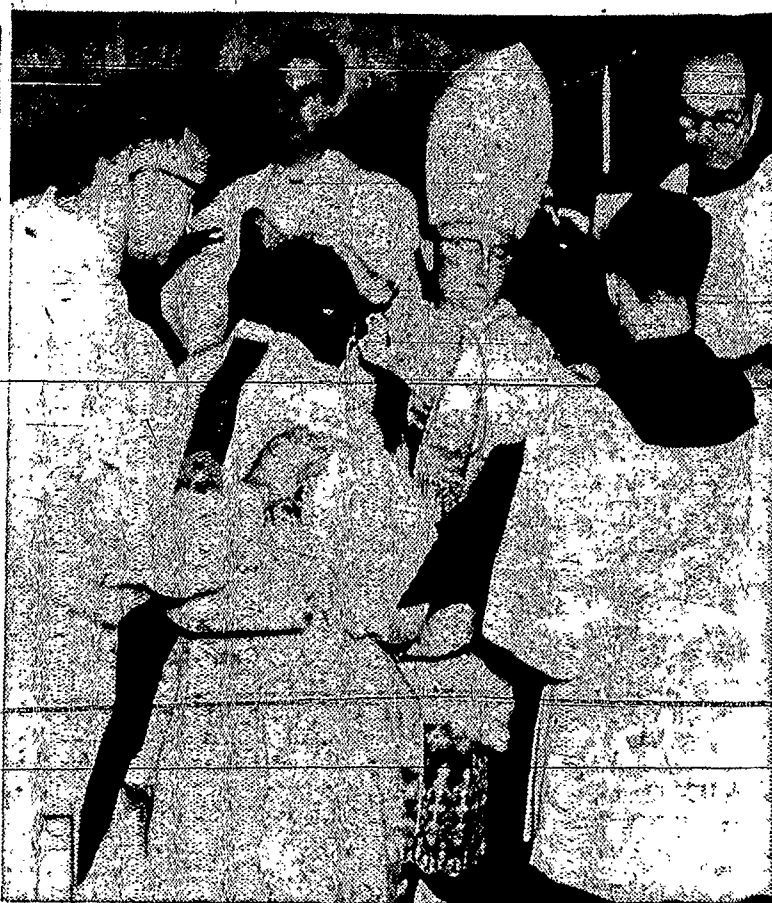

Coakley, first colored priest of the Bahamas, here in Nassau's St. Francis Xavier's Cathedral, where the new priest was baptized in 1947. After his conversion, Father Coakley's entire family joined the Church, and a sister is now a nun.

Mrs. C. H. (Marie) Regan died suddenly at her summer home at Musselman's Lake near Toronto, Canada, on July 1. She was 77 years old.

Her priest-sons, Father Bernard M. Regan, C.S.B., principal of Catholic Central High School, Detroit, and Father Basil Regan, C.S.B., principal of St. Michael's College School, Toronto. A fourth son, Frank J. Regan is a resident of Toronto.

FUNERAL MASS was held in St. Joseph's Church, Toronto, where Mrs. Regan had been a parishioner for 50 years. Father Bernard was celebrant, with Father Oscar as deacon and Father Basil as subdeacon.

Mrs. Regan was a frequent visitor to Rochester during the past 20 years and had many friends here.

## Mass, Open House To Mark Msgr. Baker's Anniversary

Services marking the twenty-first anniversary of the death of the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Nelson H. Baker, founder and builder of the world renowned Our Lady of Victory Homes and Basilica, Lackawanna, N. Y., will be held on Monday, July 29.

Many thousands from the Western New York area, northwestern Pennsylvania, and Ontario, are expected to be present to honor the memory of the man who spent, virtually all of his sixty priestly years caring for babies and boys, the poor and the sick.

THE TRADITIONAL Solemn Requiem Mass will begin at 10 A. M. in the Basilica of Our Lady of Victory, erected by Father Baker as a lasting act of thanksgiving to Our Lady.

The sermon will be preached by the Very Rev. Msgr. Joseph M. McPherson, present superintendent of Our Lady of Victory Homes of Charity.

A procession will follow to his grave in nearby Holy Cross cemetery where he is buried in the same general plot which contains his mother and father.

In extending an invitation to attend to friends in the Rochester diocese, Msgr. McPherson pointed out that open house will be observed throughout the balance of the day in all of the Institutions. Guides will be on duty to escort visitors through the Homes, the Basilica, and Father Baker's Memorial Rooms.

BORN IN 1841, Father Baker's vocation came rather late in life. He was ordained at the age of thirty-five and passed away on July 29, 1895, at the age of ninety-five in Our Lady of Victory Hospital, an institution which he himself planned and erected. A Catholic Press pioneer, he found

ed the VICTORIAN Magazine, a monthly publication, now in its sixty-third year.

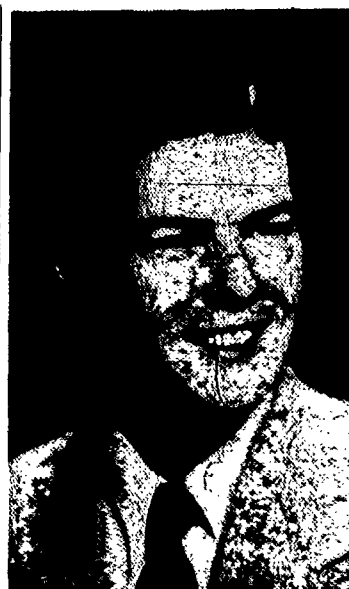

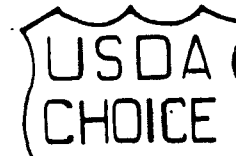

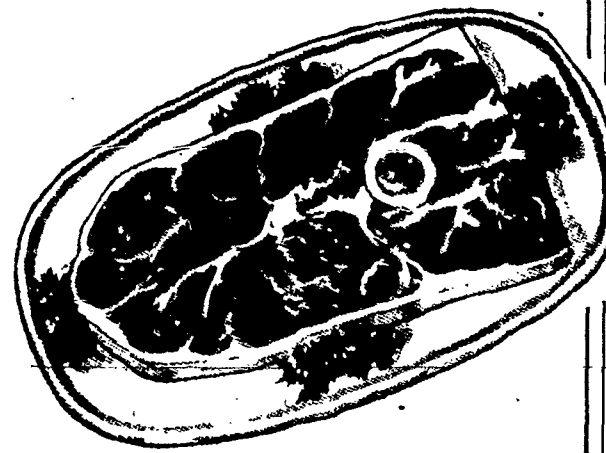
