## GOD LOVE YOU!

The subject of money is fully treated in the Scriptures which reveal the following truths:

- All money belongs to God, as the Creator and Proprietor of wealth. "The silver is Mine, and the gold is Mine, saith the Lord of Hosts." (Ageus 2:9)
- Because we have received from God we must freely give: "Let each one give according as he has determined in his heart, not grudgingly or from compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver; and God is able to make all grace abound in you, so that always having ample means, you may abound in every good work." (II Corinthians 9:7-8)
- The amount of blessings we receive depends upon the blessings that we distribute to others: "Mark this; and he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." (II Corinthians 9:6)

ONE WOMAN SENT \$5.00 TO THE HOLY FATHER through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith saying: "I am stingy, I must be love." In six years of begging for the world we have seldom received what could be called a rich gift, that is a gift in proportion to riches. This does not mean that the rich are not generous for many of them are, but few of them ever give to the missions. They build libraries, science halls, playgrounds, support civic campaigns but as a rule they do not lend their money hands and send it off to Africa, Asia or Oceania through the Holy Father's Mission Society.

IT IS THE POOR, therefore, who support the missions. God measures giving, not so much by what we give, but by what we have left. The charity and love which accompanies the gift of the poor passes to pagan souls along with the gift and this aids in conversion. The Apostles did not apparently give up very much for Our Lord, for they surrendered only a few old coats and fish nets but from another point of view, they gave up all they had and therefore, surrendered the world. If a man is thirsty it is hard to persuade him to pour on the ground a single cup of water, harder even than to prevail upon another to empty out a whole barrel. It is the triumph of grace, when the poor forsakes his little, as well as when the rich thinks his abundance as dress for Christ's sake. Make a sacrifice everyday by denying yourself some luxury and at the end of the month send it to the Holy Father for his missions through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.
