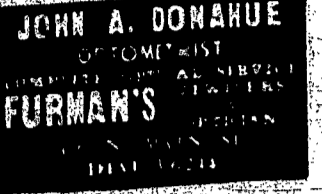


Misgr. Coffey Named To 4th Degree Post

strict silence is observed once the retreat begins. But in those where silence is broken, retreatants are cautioned to respect the wishes of those who prefer to spend the entire period in silence.

CONFESSIONS are generally heard by the retreat master at any time, and he puts himself at the disposal of retreatants for chats on any spiritual problem or difficulty.

With the increasing popularity of retreats, generally it is necessary now to place reservations for particular week-end members of a parish group or society go as a unit. Unfilled or cancelled reservations are filled in with individuals not of the group.

In any general retreat group are found men and women of wide social and economic background. A men's group might be composed of a judge, insurance man, salesman, a carpenter, a shop foreman, and a retired businessman. In a women's group will be housewives, teachers, stenographers, a nurse, a social worker and a librarian.
