Among summer recruits for Marquette League Lay Apostolate (289 Fourth Ave., New York 10, N. Y.) is Miss Betty Wheeler, Miss Wheeler, a member of Rochester's St. John the Evangelist parish, was formally employed as a medical secretary with University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry. Lay Apostles are accepted by the Marquette League without training and with no formal recommendations as to character and physical fitness. They are furnished room, board and laundry on the mission compound, but all other expenses (including fare to the mission) are part of their offering. The League helps to support 58 mission schools for the Indians which are open from September to June.

All the various occupations required to operate day and boarding schools are needed. Nurses, an athletic coach and secretary are on SOS calls from the missions.

THE MARQUETTE League Lay Apostolate is reported of great value to both missionaries and laity. It offers young men and women, undecided on a religious vocation, the opportunity to work with the Religious and live in a religious institution. It affords those unable to join a religious community because of other obligations, the opportunity to take an active role for as much time as they can spare in the Church's missionary work among our American Indians, who are the neediest of the na-

## Marquette Dental School Uses TV

Milwaukee — (NC) — Closed circuit television as a teaching aid will be used by the school of dentistry of Marquette University, this fall.

Dr. T. J. Johnson, assistant professor at the Jesuit-conducted institution, explained it. Instead of 105 students attending seven different dental demonstration classes, students in the same class would watch monitor screens as they show the work done elsewhere in the school.

Television seems especially designed to facilitate the teaching of dentistry and medicine, he said. Rooms in the newly completed new wing of the dental school, Dr. Johnson pointed out, are equipped and designed for television.

## Payroll Plan Aids College Building

Steubenville, Ohio — (NC) — The Huberts Coal Company of Follansbee, W. Va., has agreed to sponsor an unusual voluntary payroll deduction plan to aid the College of Steubenville in the construction of new buildings.

Father Phillip Clarke, T.O.R., director of development at the college and originator of the plan, announced it here. The college is conducted by the Franciscan Fathers, Third Order Regular.

Under the program, those employees who volunteer to participate will have about 25 cents taken from each week's pay and set aside for the college.

This will total about \$13 a year for each worker, the cost of one square foot of classroom space, according to Father Clarke.
