

# The Scapular

My one reaction is intense sadness that anyone would declare she loved God and herate me for also loving His beautiful Mother. I have decided not to answer the letter, but instead I am going to ask all those who love Our blessed Mother to pray that those people who blindly try to love the Son while excluding the Mother will also come to know and love Her.

Practically everyone who writes for a Scapular also includes a question. At first I tried to answer each communication personally, but I finally decided against this and so am taking up some of the questions today.

Regarding the actual wearing of the Scapular we were told that the scapular must be worn over the shoulders in such a manner that one part hangs in front of the body and the other in the back worn in any other way, it carries no indulgences.

It is not necessary, however, to sew the Scapular next to the skin. It may be worn over one's clothes or even enclosed in some sort of case. In the latter event the panels of the Scapular must be actually attached to the cords which should join them so that, when the covering removed, the Scapular would be intact.

At first the Scapular worn by lay people was the same as the Scapular of the habit of the Carmelite priest; later the Scapular for lay people assumed the smaller size it has today.

In a subsequent column I shall discuss the Scapular Medal concerning which I had so many questions.

holding the Book of the Gospels for the celebrant. One couldn't hold it any other way without causing a shower of cards.

Never, outside of a religious goods store, have we seen so many holy cards, but every one precious.

At the Ash Wednesday section is the parish-issued leaflet on Lent, how to make a private Way of the Cross, rules for fasting and the like.

There is a card to the Miraculous Infant Jesus of Prague; a prayer for the right vocation; one enrolling her as a benefactor of the College and Seminary of Our Lady of the Angels.

The anniversary of her first Communion is marked with a card from her second grade teacher: "Dear Ginny," it reads, "May you always stay as close to Our dear Lord as you are today. Sister Leonora." And another: "In remembrance of your Confirmation Day, Sister M. Antonine, C.S.C."

One comes across the plastic enclosed "Memorare," another to St. Anne — on July 26 — and a prayer of consecration to Mary Immaculate.

Treasured and inscribed to Ginny is the ordination card of 1917 of the then Father Bryan J. McEntegart, now Bishop of Brooklyn; ordination cards of Fathers Walter Sullivan, David Foley and Malachy J. Higginson, Salviatorian. On the back of Father Higginson's is "An Irish Wish" which Ginny often quotes:

"May the road rise to meet you  
May the wind be ever at your back  
May the good Lord ever keep you in the hollow of His hand  
May your heart be as warm as your hearthstone  
And when you come to die may the wall of the poor be the only sorrow you'll leave behind  
May God Bless you always."

THEN, THERE are other cards, so very many of them — reminding her to pray for the souls of departed friends and relatives. Some of them, like Mr. Fallon, our next door neighbor, and Father John Callaghan, boyhood friend of the Head of the House. Ginny knows personally whether she knew them or not, these souls are not forgotten by this eleven year old.
