

Father Crowell To Mark Silver Jubilee As Priest

The Rev. John J. Crowell, C.S.S.R., vice pastor of St. Joseph Church, Rochester, and in charge of the Perpetual Help Wednesday novenas will observe the silver jubilee of his ordination to the priesthood on Sunday, August 18.

He will celebrate solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving in St. Joseph's at 11:30 a.m. assisted by other Redemptorists. Also joining with him will be the Very Rev. Gerald J. Whelan, C.S.S.R., who passed to a classmate who observed his silver jubilee on May 20 this year.

A RECEPTION for Father Crowell who has a brother, a priest and two sisters in Religion will take place in the afternoon from 3:30 to 5 p.m. in St. Joseph's School Hall. Miss Catherine Paris is chairman.

Father Crowell was born in Boston, Mass., the son of Michael and the late Margaret Murray Crowell. His father, the Rev. Thomas J. Crowell, pastor of St. Charles Church, Mt. Bethel, Pa. He has three sisters, Sr. Margaret Francis, C.S.C. of Alexandria, Va., and Sr. Constance C.S.C. superior of St. Paul School, New York City, and Miss Mary Elizabeth Crowell of Boston.

After attending Bishop Cheverus School in Boston, the future Father Crowell attended St. Mary's Redemptorist College at South East, Pa. and made his novitiate at the Redemptorist House, Ilichester, Md. where he was professed in 1927. He made advanced studies at Mt. St. Alphonse Seminary in Esopus, N.Y. where he was ordained on June 19, 1932.

AS A REDEMPTORIST priest he took assignments on July 1934 to Puerto Rico, in 1934 his parish work in Brooklyn; in 1937 to Annapolis, Maryland and in 1939 back to Brooklyn.

Father Crowell came to Rochester as vice pastor of St. Joseph Church in 1948. Since 1948 he has been conducting the Novena in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help which attracts throngs at the various services to St. Joseph's each Wednesday.

He was professor at Nazareth Motherhouse and Sacred Heart Convent and is now professor at Sisters of Mercy Motherhouse, School of the Holy Childhood Convent and St. Bernard Seminary.

Father Crowell is also director of the Archdiocesan Office of Holy Family at St. Joseph's Commercial School.

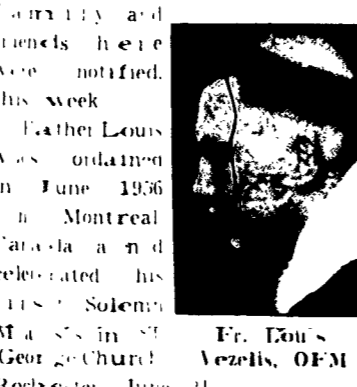


Basilian Novices Take First Vows

He devoted his first year of priestly work to preaching in home missions. In company with two other Franciscans from Canada he will seek to establish a regular monastery and novitiate for Korean aspirants to the Franciscan life.

Father Louis will reside at the Franciscan Monastery, Mokong St., No. 96 Taelon St., Korea.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Vezich, 111 Dayton St., Rochester.

Legion Of Mary 'Brings Christ To Market Place'

Legion of Mary, Rochester Community, is "bringing Christ into the Market Place" with a Catholic Information Booth at the Monroe County Fair grounds, the week of August 19-24.

The booth is under the direction of Rev. John Meiklinger, spiritual director; Richard Siebert, general chairman and Mrs. Mary Schell, chairman of personnel.

Approximately 90 to 100 Legion workers will donate 2 to 3 hours each in an effort to bring Catholics to the attention of the world. The theme of the booth is "Do You Worship God As God Wishes To Be Worshiped?"

A SERIES of topics outlining the steps to Catholicism has been prepared and will serve as the principal exhibit. Among these topics are: "Does Atheism Make Sense?" "Can You Trust Those Foreign Gospels?" "Baptism: Quiet Ceremony or of Absolute Necessity?" and "Confession: A Fresh Start?"

The Legionnaires staffing the booth will greet visitors, show them around the exhibit and answer questions about any of the topics. This is the third year that the Rochester Community of the Legion of Mary has gone to the Monroe County Fair to make friends with our non-Catholic neighbors.

Nazareth Academy, Fremont Mission Unit and the Legion have purchased more than 2,000 pamphlets for free distribution.

Pius X Church To Bless Statue Of Parish Patron

An outdoor statue of St. Pius X in marble will be blessed next Sunday night at 8 p.m. in front of the new St. Pius X Church.

Since it shows St. Pius X as a boy of 11 as he went barefoot to the nearby town of Castelfranco, the figure is unique. Standing bareheaded and barefoot, reading a book, he leans against a tree stump.

The statue, chiseled out of Carrara marble and weighing 2800 pounds, was received recently from Italy.

THE ORIGINAL statue was sculpted by Celsus Cardinal Costantini and is outside Rome, Italy. The boyish pose is a reminder to youth of the value of study, as well as the minor value of clothes, shoes, etc.

Rev. Joseph P. Brennan who returned in July from graduate studies in Rome, will speak on the occasion. He was present at the canonization of St. Pius X in 1954, and was instrumental in obtaining the statue for the church at 3000 Crail Ave.

Rochesterian Joins North Dakota Priest In Caring For Boys

A Rochesterian will join forces with a North Dakota priest around the first of September in running the Home on the Range for Boys at Sentinel Butte, N.D.

Frank Riemer, a member of the Legion of Mary and a communicant of St. Anne Church, Rochester, decided to aid the Rev. Elwood Cassidy, less than a year after meeting the priest in New York City.

Father Cassidy has been running the home almost alone since it was founded in 1949. Riemer hopes to aid him in his program for homeless boys.

Riemer and Father Cassidy have a number of things in common. Both began their careers in business in New York City. Riemer as an insurance interviewer for Metropolitan and Father Cassidy at the Chase National Bank.

Riemer left the insurance business to study with the Trappists in Utah and recently has been in charge of the Halloran & Nare Co. office on the Rochester State Hospital project.
