

Nazareth Delegates At National Congress

Nazareth College of Rochester will be represented at the 14th annual National Congress of National Federation of Catholic College Students at the Hotel Roosevelt, New York City, Aug. 26 to 31, by Miss Angela Pina, junior, Saratoga Springs, the N.F.C.C.S. senior delegate.

Prior to the Congress, from August 22 through the 25, there is a series of workshops, two of which are being attended by Nazareth College representatives.

THE INTERNATIONAL student seminar will be held at Marymount College, New York, under the sponsorship of the National Newman Club Federation and the National Federation of Catholic College Students. It will be an experiment in cooperation aimed at an appraisal of the problems and the needs of international students and as assessment of the programs and progress in the field during the past two years.

The seminar will also serve as a center for the exchange of information and ideas between American and foreign students regarding their mutual problems.

Miss Mary Jo Gleason of Auburn, president of the Fremont Mission Unit at Nazareth College, and Miss Elaine McAvoy of Geneva, a member of the executive board, will attend the seminar. Miss Gleason will give a paper on the research which Nazareth's Mission Unit has been conducting over a two-year period at the request of the Catholic Students Mission Crusade.

NAZARETH COLLEGE students will represent the National Catholic Students Mission Crusade at the seminar. 75 Pilgrims To Board Plane August 29 For Hibernian Pilgrimage To Knock

Seventy-five pilgrims under the direction of Father Michael P. O'Brien, county AOH chaplain, will board a chartered DC6 of the Royal Dutch Airlines, KLM, Thursday, August 29 at 8 p.m. at Rochester Airport for the second Hibernian Pilgrimage to the famed shrine in Knock, Ireland.

The group will fly to Shannon and travel by bus to the Shrine of Our Blessed Mother at Knock in County Mayo.

AFTER DEVOTIONS at the Shrine, the group will disperse. Some will visit relatives; others will tour through Europe to Lourdes and an audience with the Holy Father. The group will leave the Dublin Airport on Wednesday, Sept. 18, and land in Rochester at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, Sept. 19.

Included among the pilgrims are five priests of the Rochester Diocese: Father George S. Wood, Director of the Propagation of the Faith; Father William Roche, Associate Superintendent of Schools; Father Frederick Straub of St. Boniface Parish; Father Bernard Kuchman of Holy Redeemer Parish; and Father Bernard Dolan of St. Francis Xavier Parish.

The first chartered flight of the Hibernians to Knock took place in July, 1953. It is planned to have a sheriff's escort from St. Monica Church, where the

group will gather, to the Rochester Airport, arriving there at 6:00 p.m. With two exceptions all of the pilgrims are from the city of Rochester, several of them having made previous pilgrimages.

Tour arrangements for the individual members are being handled by William Mullane of Kahlfeisch Travel Agency, and an estimated year has elapsed in preparing the itineraries.

An audience with the Holy Father is being petitioned through Archbishop Sigismund, Secretary to the Holy Father for the Society of the Propagation of the Faith, and Monsignor Eminger, who is in charge of all the audiences.
