### Cardinal Lists Meeting With KC Leaders of State

His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York and State Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, will receive leaders of the order from all parts of the Empire State following the 10 a. m. Solemn Mass in St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York, on Sunday, Sept. 1.

The occasion will be the annual State-wide Meeting to be held at the Park Sheraton Hotel, Manhattan, at which State Deputy Emmett Burke of Yonkers will meet with other State officers, State committee heads, and district deputies to make plans for the coming fraternal year's activities.

EMPHASIS in the K. of C. program this year will stress the development of Youth Leadership and a continuing fight on the side and distribution of indecent literature, Burke said. ### Pastor Watches Cradle To Goal Post Career of Nephew

Tiltonville, Ohio (NC)—A Tiltonville pastor has a special interest in John Unitas, professional football player who was voted "outstanding Catholic athlete of 1956" by the Catholic War Veterans of Baltimore.

When Father C. C. Superfisky, pastor of St. Joseph's church here, offered his first solemn Mass in Pittsburgh 24 years ago, he was given another assignment—baptizing his nephew, John Unitas. In 1955 he officiated at John's wedding in Pittsburgh, and last year he baptized the Unitas' first child.

John plays quarterback for the Baltimore Colts of the National Football League. Last year he was voted "rookie of the year" by Baltimore newspapers. He completed 110 out of 198 passes, good for 1498 yards and nine touchdowns.

He is the son of Father Superfisky's eldest sister, Mrs. Helen Unitas. Father Superfisky affectionately refers to him as "the kid of the century."

### Italy Scientists Aid IGY Research

Rome—(NC)—Outstanding Catholic Italian scientists are taking part in the International Geophysical year (IGY).

President of the special committee for coordinating the tasks of 33 Italian scientific groups participating in the IGY is Prof. Paolo Dore. A specialist in geodesy (a branch of applied mathematics used to determine the shape and size of the earth), he is a member of the Catholic Graduate movement.

Secretary of the same committee, Maurizio Giorgi, is an expert in geomagnetism. He is also active in the graduate movement.

### Fr. Erb Named Publicity Head For Mission Meetings

The Rev. Charles J. Erb, a Divine Word missionary with world-wide experience, and a Rochester native was named to head the publicity committee for the Mission Secretariat meetings in Washington, Sept. 9, 10 and 11, it was announced this week.

Father Erb whose mission activities have taken him to Alaska, Europe and Africa is widely known in Rochester for managing the World Mission Scenerama held in the Community War Memorial in October 1955.

THE MISSION Secretariat located at 1312 Massachusetts Ave., Washington and in charge of Father Frederick A. McGuire, C.M. as executive secretary is a clearing house for information and services to aid American Catholic foreign mission work.

Some 600 missionaries from every corner of the globe are expected at the Secretariat meetings in September. At this largest gathering of its kind in the United States, priests, Brothers, Sisters and lay apostles will discuss problems they encounter in spreading the Faith throughout the world.

More than 100 heads of religious orders will discuss problems of administration, Medical and educational work in the field, the training of future missionaries, recruitment and editorial work will be discussed in group meetings.

Beginning in 1957, an award will be given each year to a layman or laywoman whose interest in America's mission work has been outstanding. It will be known as the Worldmission Award.

### Benedictine Abbot Dies in Alabama

Cullman—(NC)—Funeral services for Abbot Boniface Seng, O.S.B., president emeritus of St. Bernard College and abbot of the Benedictine abbey here, were held at Sacred Heart Church... Abbot Boniface, 89, died (Aug. 1) shortly after he offered Mass in his private chapel. He had been in failing health since 1952, when he retired from active administration of the Benedictine establishment here.

### Jesuit Bishop Marks 50 Years As Priest

Archbishop James T. G. Hayes of Cagayan, Philippine Islands will celebrate his 50th anniversary as a priest on August 15. A New Yorker by birth, Archbishop Hayes was consecrated a bishop in 1933 by the late Cardinal Hayes of New York. He was elevated to Archbishop of Cagayan in 1951.

He was born in 1889 and entered the Jesuit Order in 1907. After a teaching assignment at Boston College he was sent to missionary work in the Philippines in 1926. During World War II he was held under house-arrest by the Japanese. He has not been back to the United States since his consecration ceremony.
