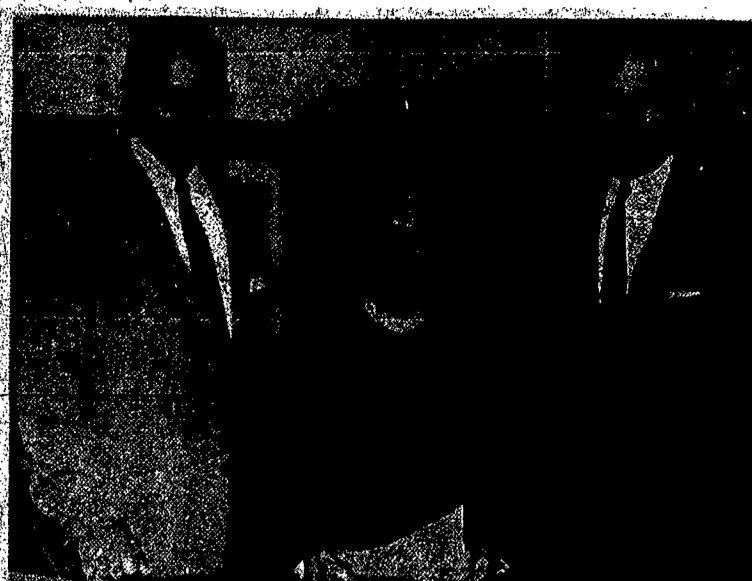

## 600 Men To Open Drive For St. Ambrose Church

Organization of a committee of more than 600-men began this week in preparation for a new church building fund drive in St. Ambrose parish, Empire Blvd. and Culver Rd.

Three-year pledges, with a minimum goal of \$375,000, will be sought in a parish-wide canvass Sunday, Oct. 6.

The Rev. Frank W. Mason, pastor, announced that Frank J. Erb will be chairman of the general committee, with Charles S. Zicari heading the advanced gifts group.

SEVING WITH Erb will be vice-chairmen Charles Hohmann, Dr. Charles Maggio, Kenneth Scarciatta, J. Edgar Schiefen and Jack Williams. Vice-chairman of the advanced gifts committee will be Fred Bendon and Elmer Frank.

Advisory committee members include Joseph D'Amico, Frank Hempel, Louis Luppa, Camillus Kesselring, Daniel Piscitello, Martin Roessel and Frank Schwartz. Nearly 200 men who will serve as committee captains will meet at 8 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 29, in the school hall.

Increasing parish population and rising school applications have made a new church imperative, Father Mason pointed out. It will seat 1,100 persons and will front Empire at the corner of Culver.
