

4,344 Children Study Religion During Summer

A total of 4,344 children, an increase of 89 over last year, attended the Religious Vacation Schools conducted under the auspices of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, according to the Rev. Albert H. Schnacky, diocesan director.

Fifty areas in the Diocese of Rochester were provided with these vacation schools, Father Schnacky reported. St. Ambrose parish Rochester which also conducts a parochial school, and vacation schools in Ontario and Phelps were new this year.
