Walks From Paris To Learn Spanish

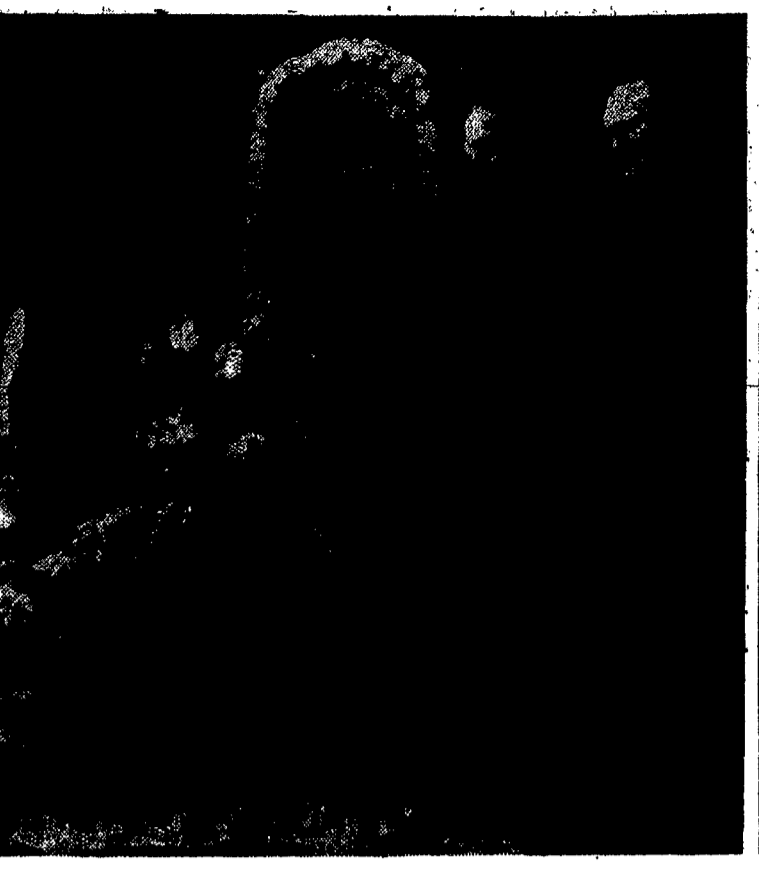

Outdoor Shrine Dedicated To Our Lady Of Lourdes

An attractive, permanent shrine in honor of Our Lady of Lourdes, erected on the lawn of the Falcon - Peroraro residence, 2811 Lake Ave. was blessed Sunday afternoon at 3:30 p.m. in the presence of 100 friends and guests.

OFFICIATING at the blessing ceremony was the Rev. Sebastian Falcone, O.F.M. Cap., instructor at the Capuchin Franciscans' St. Lawrence Seminary, Beacon, N. Y., who is at present on vacation at the home of his parents and sister. Leading the recitation of the Rosary and imparting closing Benediction on those participating in the 20-minute ceremony was the Rev. Robert H. Fennessy, pastor of Holy Cross Church.

ATOP the highest point of a three-level rock garden, the polychrome statue of Our Lady of Lourdes is inclosed in a six-foot niche constructed of mortar and pitted limestone.

On the lower level stands that statue of St. Bernadette, the French peasant girl privileged with various apparitions of the Virgin Mary in 1858. No professional services were used in the construction of the shrine.

Charles D. Mercer and John F. Burke, have announced the formation of the law firm of Mercer & Burke, with offices at 31 Exchange St., Rochester.

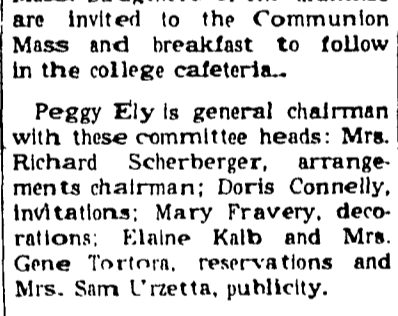
Mercer is a graduate of Yale University and received his law degree from Cornell University. He was admitted to practice in 1934.
