

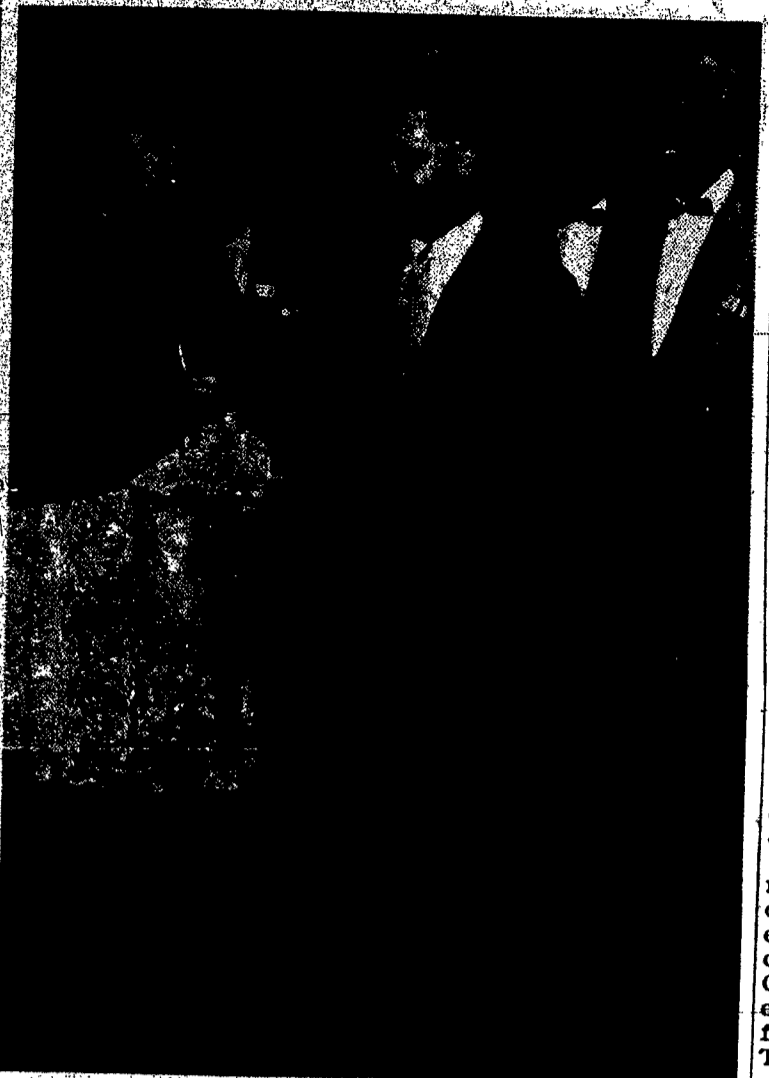

Renovated Columbus Bowling Alleys To Reopen Saturday

Entirely renovated during the summer, Columbus Civic Center Bowling Alleys will reopen for the 1957-1958 season on Saturday Sept. 7 with an attractive "new look."

League bowling is scheduled from Monday through Friday. City-wide interest in the leagues is shown in the groups participating. Monday's, the early squad is comprised of the Liberty Bells, a group of young business women who have bowled at the same time for several years.

THE LATE MONDAY squad comprises the Knights of Columbus Ladies Auxiliary now starting their fifth season. This group started bowling in 1953 with little or no experience but is now regarded by the alley operators as the most improved women bowlers group in the city.

Tuesday, the early squad consists of a group of women from Bauch and Lomb Optical Co. who are starting to bowl at these alleys for the first time.

Wednesday night is entirely reserved for the fast 16 Knights of Columbus men's league. Several teams from his league made creditable showings in the large Catholic League with the Mutiniers captained by Pop Gumm and featuring Cliff Sargent and Jim Tiffin finishing on top.

Thursday, the early squad is the Columbus Business Women. This league, one of the old standbys has been bowling at the alleys since Joe Garin was operating them.

THE LATE Thursday squad represents men of the Knights of St. John. This league has openings for Catholic men who are interested in bowling at 9:15 p.m. Friday, the Camera Works Office League takes over the early squad. This men's league has some of the better Kodak bowlers. The Brownie team captained by Walter Karle won, last year, the All Kodak team championship.

Saturday, the children take over in the morning and early afternoon. In the evening, St. Andrew Seminary boys bowl at 8 o'clock.

Sunday is open bowling day. The public is asked to inspect the alleys and try them out.

Aquinas Grad Gets Perfect Mark
Lt. Neil V. Campbell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Campbell of 90 Redessa Rd., has become the first student pilot to achieve a perfect mark in the advanced academic training course at Naval Air Station Ground Training at Corpus Christi, Tex.

His mark was the highest recorded in the ten years since ground training adopted its present grading system. He also received a "highest possible" mark as an advanced instrument student in pre-flight training at Pensacola, Fla.

Lt. Campbell is a graduate of Aquinas Institute and the University of Nebraska where he was a member of the N.R.O.T.C. He served five years aboard a cruiser and destroyer escort in the Pacific Fleet.

Rome, Venice Spur Modesty Drive
Rome — (NC) — A pastoral letter by Cardinal Roncalli of Venice calling for modesty of dress has spurred Rome police to threaten action against tourists parading about in scanty summer attire here.

The Cardinal's letter urged Venetians to wear clothes in keeping with Christian morals and asked civil authorities to enforce laws requiring modest dress on city streets.

The Rome police department issued a circular the next day giving notice that scantily clad tourists would be asked to leave "respectable places" and to keep off the streets.

The police directive made it clear that women tourists are the main offenders, and threatened that if tourists did not comply their embassies would be notified.

Couples Retreat Held In Arkansas
Little Rock — (RNS) — Fifty couples attended the first Catholic retreat for married people ever held in Arkansas. Msgr. James E. O'Connell conducted 44 hours of counseling and meditation in St. James Seminary here.

Twenty-one parishes in 13 Arkansas cities were represented. One couple came from Kalamazoo, Mich., and another from Kennett, Mo.

"It is a time to make happy marriages happier and to ease any difficulties that may have arisen," said Msgr. O'Connell, director of lay retreats for the Little Rock Diocese.

Parishioners Build Church In Barn

Chicago — (NC) — Residents in the new Catholic parish in South Holland, a suburb of Chicago, have taken a page from pioneer history by establishing a temporary church in a barn, which they have remodeled with their own hands.

THE BARN happened to be located on land where the permanent church and school will be built after funds have been raised for their construction. The pastor of the parish of St. Jude the Apostle, Father James E. Naughton, decided to convert it for use in the interim.

The volunteer remodelers under the direction of an architect, worked weekends and nights to complete the job in time to hold the first Mass there on schedule. A brick altar with marble trim was constructed by bricklayer parishioners. The 15-foot high cross outside was fabricated by a sheet metal worker in the parish. Carpenters and wall board installers from the congregation finished the interior.

Washington — (RNS) — A Catholic priest is among ten Americans who will receive honorary awards from Queen Elizabeth at a ceremony here during her visit to this country in October.

The Rev. Edward J. Whelan, S.J., a native of San Francisco, will be made an Honorary Officer of the British Empire for his "staunch support of Anglo-American cooperation."

Father Whelan, 70, is a former president of the University of San Francisco and of Loyola University in Los Angeles. He also was superior of Jesuit retreats in Northern California.
