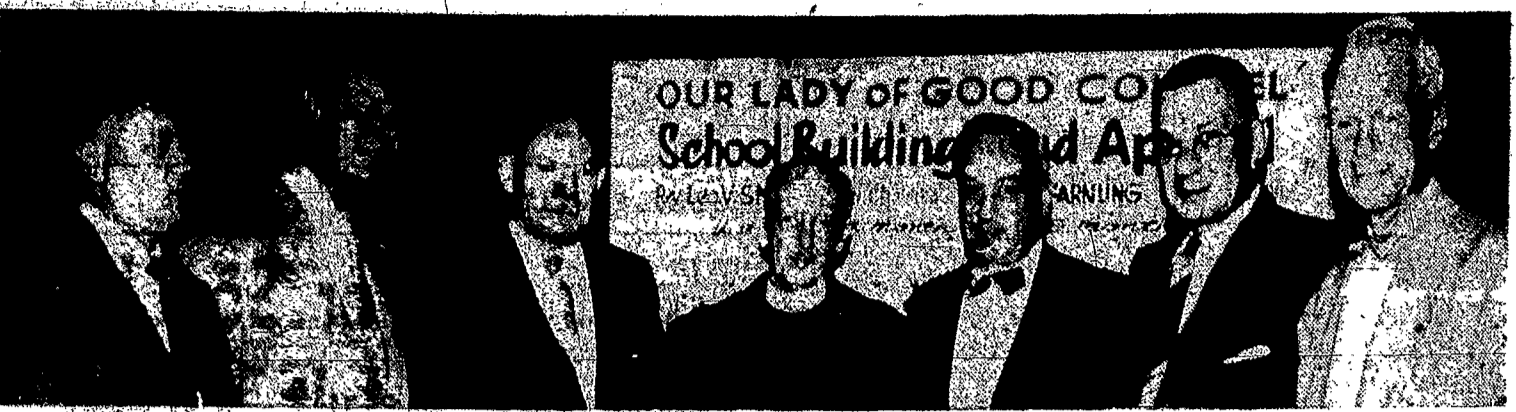

400 Men Enlisted In Fund Drive At St. Ambrose

More than 400 men of St. Ambrose parish who will serve as lieutenants in the new church fund drive will meet at 8 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 19, in the school hall. It was announced this week by the Rev. Frank W. Mason, pastor.

Three-year pledges, with a minimum goal of \$75,000 will be sought in a parishwide canvass Sunday afternoon, Oct. 6, toward erection of a new church building at the corner of Empire Boulevard and Culver Road. It will replace present church quarters in the combination school-church building.

Necessity for additional school facilities ranks in importance with the need for larger church space, Father Mason pointed out. Present church quarters will be renovated into six classrooms.

CURRENT enrollment in St. Ambrose School, the pastor said, is 821 taxing the capacity. Two classrooms are conducted in a small frame structure behind the main building. Growing parish population portends increasing applications. Father Mason added.

Present church quarters, seating 640 also are inadequate. The pastor declared. Three of the nine Sunday Masses are celebrated in the school basement simultaneously with Masses in the church above.

THE PROPOSED reformation church, designed to seat 1100, will answer both church and school space problems, the pastor noted in a message to parishioners. It will be one of the largest churches in the diocese.

Campaign committee plans call for a meeting of the advanced gifts and advisory groups on Sept. 23, a pep rally for the entire church on Oct. 2, and a kick-off dinner on Oct. 5. More than 600 men will work on the drive.

Another Floor For School, Objective Of Good Counsel Parish Fund Drive

An addition to Our Lady of Good Counsel School, consisting of an additional story to include eight classrooms, is planned according to the Rev. Leo V. Smith, pastor who announced today opening of a campaign to provide funds for the enlargement of the school.

FATHER SMITH told his people "that a school with the capacity of 400 pupils is inadequate to care for the present enrollment of 340 children. Examination of the Baptismal records and new registrations show definitely that within a short time this number will be even higher. To meet this great parish need, I have organized Our Lady of Good Counsel School Building Fund Appeal. It is a heavy task and I ask that you share with me this great burden."

General solicitation of the parish will take place Sunday afternoon, Oct. 6 from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. All parishioners are asked to remain at home during that period.

Officers of the group said this week that disbursements last year included a total of \$640.55 for students at Duquesne University, Aquinas Institute, Our Lady of Mercy High School and Nazareth Academy.

Among miscellaneous expenditures were \$75 for assistance to an intern's family and \$73 for the Immaculate Conception day camp fund. The group also distributes food and clothing to needy persons.

Mrs. Harriet Schuyler heads the circle, which is affiliated with the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women. Members of the council have been invited to attend the tea.
