Lay Catechist Training Program Enrollment Rises At 2 Centers

Large enrollment of men and women in the Lay Catechist Training program is reported at both Confraternity of Christian Doctrine Diocesan centers this week.

The program consists of a 30-hour course in Methods of Teaching Religion taught by a Sister, Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart, and a 30-hour course in Christian Doctrine taught by Rev. Leonard A. Kelly in Fairport and Rev. William Thomas in Ithaca.

At the completion of the course in May those who qualify will receive a Teaching Certificate from His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, to Teach Religion in any parish in the Diocese.

Stressing the need for an active Confraternity of Christian Doctrine in the Diocese this week quoted Pope Pius XII who said, "Priests will not suffice for the work... Sisters will not suffice. The laity must lend their valiant cooperation and deem it their sacred duty."

In this choice field of Catholic Action the laymen can carry out Christ's command, "GO... AND TEACH..." He thus becomes a Builder of the Faith. Preparation for this important work was pointed out by the Vicar of Christ on earth, Pius XII, in his address to the "Doctors of Religion" on Oct. 14, 1951 when he said, "This must be positively insisted upon: that the teacher himself improve his knowledge by study, even the master must study unceasingly. Let him not prepare his instruction in a lazy, halfhearted or careless manner, but let him draw up his lesson plan and his method of presentation with painstaking diligence..."

THE METHOD class trains the laymen how to teach, i.e. in the special "approach" to the Catholic child in public school; in "methods" adapted to this particular field; and in a "course" especially prepared for these children that the teacher may achieve his "aim."

The Doctrine Class prepares the laity in what they must teach. The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine offers a place in Catholic Action. Everyone can find in it an opportunity to spread the Faith, the Sisters said.
