### Missionary Life Described To Aquinas Student Body

The work of the modern missionary was described by a well known missionary to the students of Aquinas Institute in a mission assembly opening the school's mission activities for the coming year.

Rev. Charles G. Erb, a Society of the Divine Word missionary father and former Rochesterian, outlined the work of his community in Africa and stressed the interest of the Holy Father in converting this continent of over 190 million souls.

Rev. John M. Wilson, C.S.B., moderator of the mission unit at Aquinas presented to Father Erb on behalf of the student body, a check to help further the African missions.

DANIEL SHAUGHNESSY, student president of the Catholic Students Mission Unit at Aquinas, presided at the assembly and gave a brief history of Aquinas mission activities.

Last year, according to Shaughnessy, a total of \$18,523 was contributed by the students of Aquinas to the annual "mission bouts" of boxing and skill for a major source of mission income. A year round project of home room collections supplies the bulk of the mission treasury.

Father Erb concluded the assembly by inviting his listeners to consider a life in the mission field, either as a missionary or a lay helper.
