Ceylon Parliament Hears Nuns Praised

Colombo — (RNS) — A Buddhist representative paid high tribute to Roman Catholic nursing nuns in a speech before the Ceylon parliament here.

R. E. Jayatilaka, member from Nawalapitwa, spoke in opposition to proposals by a Buddhist Committee of Enquiry to bar nuns from serving in the country's state-operated hospitals.

"The nursing nuns are the one bright spot in Nawalapitwa hospital notwithstanding what the Buddhist commission says," he stated.

The nuns crowded into the church of Our Lady of Guadalupe — now raised to the status of a cathedral — to see Bishop Manuel Talamas Camarero, apostolic delegate to Mexico, announce the new diocese of Chihuahua See and comprises more than 200,000 Catholics.

Bishop Talamas announced that one of his first projects would be the establishment of a seminary in the new diocese at the express wishes of Pope Plus XII.

Archbishop Edwin B. Byrne of Santa Fe, N.M., and Bishop Sidney M. Metzger of El Paso, Tex., which is just across the Mexican border, were among those occupying seats in the sanctuary.

Italian Composer's Anniversary Marked

Venice — (NC) — The 400th anniversary of the birth of Giovanni Gabrieli, one of Italy's most famous composers of sacred music, was marked by a Pontifical Mass in the Basilica of St. Mark here.

THE MASS was offered by His Eminence Angelo Giuseppe Cardinal Roncalli, Patriarch of Venice, with the assistance of Auxiliary Bishop Augusto Gianfranceschi of Venice and the clergy of St. Mark's.

Giovanni Gabrieli's music was used during the Mass. The sermon delivered by Cardinal Roncalli traced the career of the composer whose entire professional life was spent in service to Saint Mark's.

Mother Cabrini Aide Dies In Seattle At 77

Seattle — (NC) — Mother Dositea, friend and co-worker of St. Frances X. Cabrini, was buried here from the Sacred Heart Villa chapel.

The 77-year-old nun, who was superior of the Sacred Heart Villa, died (Sept. 12) at Columbus hospital here after a heart attack.

MOTHER DOSITEA spent most of her 60 years as a Missionary Sister of the Sacred Heart caring for orphans in the Seattle area.

She assisted St. Frances Cabrini in establishing an orphanage on Seattle's Beacon Hill in 1903. Later, Mother Dositea founded the Sacred Heart Villa.

She was born in Briones, Switzerland, on December 11, 1879.
