100 Knights, Ladies Make Pilgrimage To Auriesville

Four bus loads of members of Rochester Knights of St. John and Ladies Auxiliary left for Auriesville More than 100 made the trip by bus, while many others went in their private cars.

Leaders in charge of the groups were Colonel Emil G. Eckert, Mrs. Olive Eckert, Mrs. Mayme Uhl, Charles H. Mura, Joseph Zimmer and A. G. Miller. Arriving at the Pilgrim Grounds, they led the procession reciting the Rosary with Father Roberts of the Society of Jesus, followed with the Station of the Cross with Father O'Brian of the shrine staff.

Benediction followed in the Colosseum, and then the long trail to the ravine chanting the litanies of the Saints was taken.

Mass was celebrated in the Colosseum, with Father Stanley of the Society of Jesus delivering a talk on the lives of the Martyrs "who came to this country to carry out the same ideas for the freedom of the sons of God."

The pilgrimage was attended by some 5,000 people from all parts of the State of New York, and some from Pennsylvania. Approximately 800 men and women wore the Uniforms of the Knights of St. John.
