# Bishop's Day To Attract Large Elmira Audience

Chemung-Schuyler Deanery is reported making great plans to pay a fitting tribute to His Excellency Bishop Kearney on the Silver Jubilee of his Consecration, Sunday, Oct. 27th.

A caravan of many buses has been reserved for the round trip to the Rochester War Memorial where nearly 10,000 Catholics of the Diocese will gather for the unprecedented tribute.

Private cars are not recommended. They will not be permitted to enter the area of the War Memorial because of the flood of buses that will pour into the area from the four corners of the Diocese.

Chemung-Schuyler Deanery, headed by Msgr. William J. Brien, Dean and Pastor of St. Patrick Church, hopes to be represented not only by a large delegation from each parish, but also by the officers of each Catholic organization in the Deanery.

## Ukrainian Church Pastor To Mark Golden Jubilee

Very Rev. Waldimir B. Dowhovick, pastor of St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church, Elmira Heights will be honored on Sunday evening, Oct. 6 with a banquet at Mark Twain Hotel to mark the 50th anniversary of his Ordination to the Holy Priesthood.

Two years after his ordination, Father Dowhovick was called to the United States by the late Bishop Stephen Soter Ortynsky, first Bishop of the Ukrainian Catholic Diocese of the U.S.

His first assignment was in Cleveland where he was without a church or congregation. Working in his untiring fashion, he assembled a congregation and built a church on Cleveland's westside. Other assignments included Pittsburgh and Allentown in Pennsylvania and at Detroit, Mich.

SINCE COMING to Elmira Heights the Jubilarian has made remarkable progress in furthering the work of the parish. He organized The Sacred Heart Society, the Sodality of the Blessed Virgin and was the prime mover in establishing the Fishon-Maselkur Ukrainian Catholic Post 1178 of the Catholic War Veterans.

Ground was broken for a new Church edifice to accommodate the vastly increased congregation and it is expected that the dedication will take place some time around Easter of 1958.
