Well, he did! But this austerity message is not for the Jesuits alone. The Holy Father in the same message said that it applied to all religious orders.

BUT NOT RELIGIOUS ORDERS ALONE In his letter on Lourdes he asked all priests and laity to forego the pleasures of the world and to develop "a love of pentience without which there is no hope of eternal salvation '


