St. Mary's Building Drive Forseen Success In Corning

Corning — Official financial report on the \$200,000 fund drive of St. Mary's parish will be made known today. Indications of last Sunday afternoon's two-hour house-to-house canvass promise a successful campaign.

The Rev. Thomas F. Brennan, parish pastor and Joseph Turey, campaign chairman, this week reported that most parish contacts met with "huge success" but that several subscriptions and gifts were still outstanding, making an exact financial report on the drive impossible until this weekend.

The \$200,000 being sought will be used to start a building program at the parish school, including ground breaking, resurfacing for a new eight-room parochial school.


