Martin B. O'Neil, Father Of Nun, Rites Conducted

The funeral of Martin B. O'Neil, 84, former Mayor of Rochester, was held with Solemn Requiem Mass at Holy Apostles Church after services in Farrell Brothers Funeral Home, Wednesday, Oct. 9.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Predmore assisted by the Rev. John E. Roach, Deacon and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles P. Sheehy, Subdeacon. The Rev. George Weimann was also in the Sanctuary.

Mr. O'Neil was the father of a Sister of St. Joseph and grandfather of a Sister of Mercy. He served as the last Mayor of Rochester under the old mayor-common council charter in 1926 and 1927.

His death occurred at St. Anne's Home, Oct. 6, 1957 where he entered eight months ago. His residence for years was at 18 Austin St.

Educated in public and parochial schools, the future mayor took a commercial course at Taylor's Business College and an architectural course at Mechanical Institute—fore-runner of Rochester Institute of Technology.

His career covered terms as supervisor of the 15th Ward, later Mayor and deputy city assessor when he retired. He had wide business experience and served in appointive offices.

In his early days he was active in the Knights of Columbus and was a Grand Commander of Musa Caravan, Order of the Alhambra.

Mr. O'Neil leaves his wife, Etta; three daughters, Sister Mary Martina of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph; Mrs. Martin E. Quinn and Mrs. Joseph J. Doran; a sister, Mrs. Margaret Rooney, four grandchildren among whom is Sister Marie Martin of the Sisters of Mercy and eight great-grandchildren.

Twenty-three students of Aquinas Institute were awarded St. Thomas Club keys, highest scholastic achievement in the school. The awards were made last Tuesday during a full school assembly by Very Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B. president of St. John Fisher College and guest speaker.

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass which preceded the presentations was offered by Rev. John Spratt, C.S.B. of the school faculty.

RECIPIENTS of the awards, which require a ninety percent average, were commended by Father Murphy with a warning to those whom much has been expected.
