Another game has been added to the Aquinas schedule on Nov. 2 when the "Little Irish" will travel to Watertown to meet Watertown High.

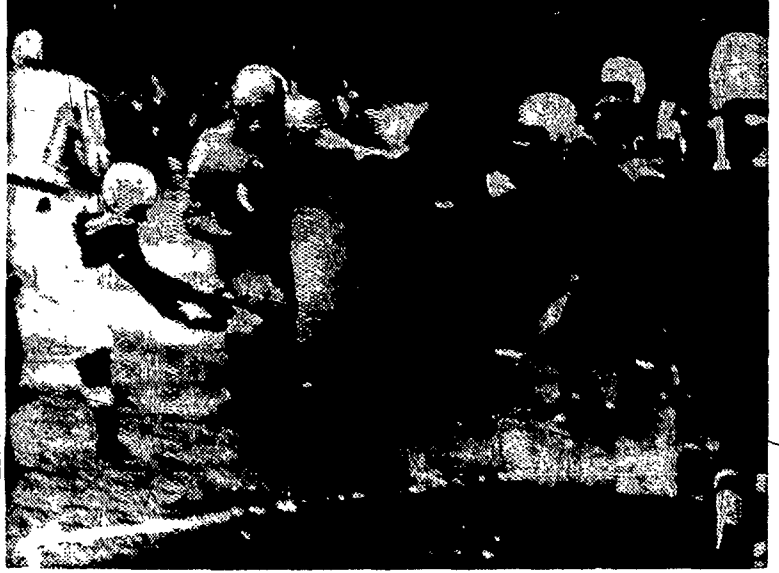
THE BLUE AND GOLD Lions of Erie (Erie Academy) under
