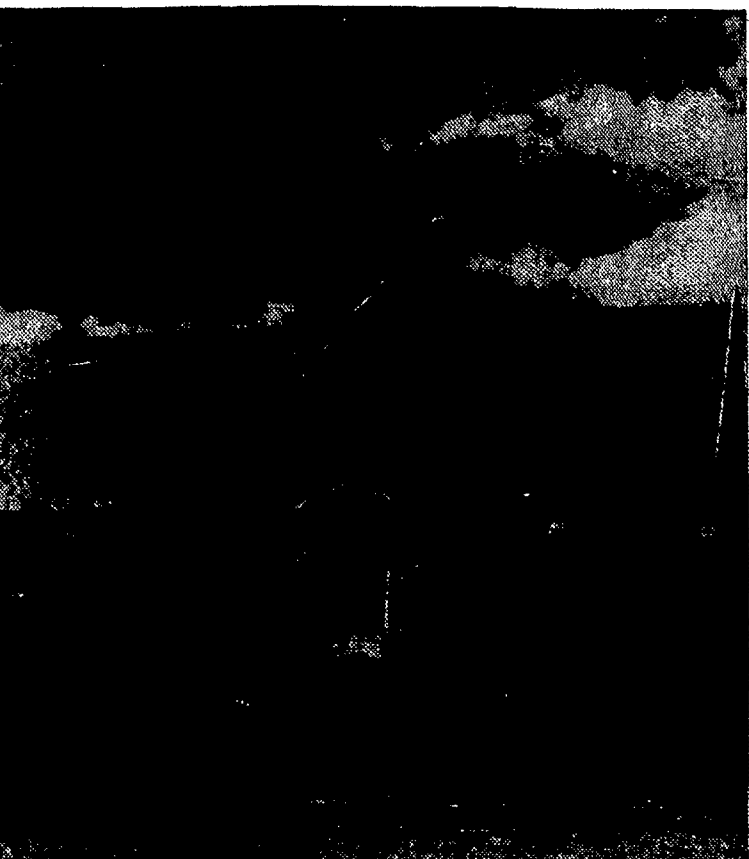

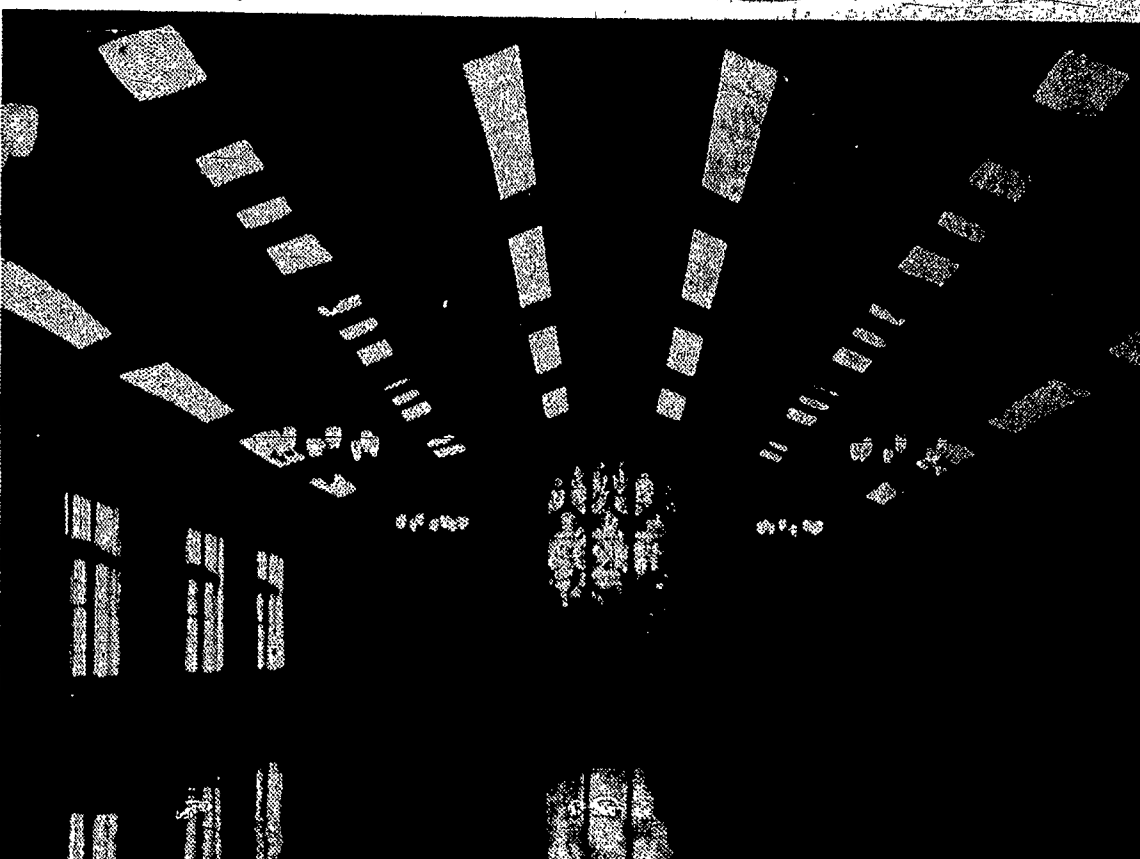

Trumansburg Parish To Mark Centennial

St. James Parish, Trumansburg will mark its centenary this Sunday, Nov. 3 with a Jubilee Mass celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Kearney at 10:30 a.m. Bishop Kearney will also preach the centenary sermon, Father Francis A. Marks, pastor, announced today.

The pastor, who was appointed to Trumansburg in 1954, has also announced that a Requiem High Mass will be offered on Saturday, Nov. 2, All Souls Day, for deceased parishioners. Father Marks will be celebrant of this Mass.

A JUBILEE dinner will be held in the church hall on Monday, Nov. 18 at 8:30 p.m. Mrs. Beverly Ness, president of the Altar Society and Lawrence Potter, president of the Holy Name Society, are cochairmen.

First St. James Church, Trumansburg, was opened in 1857 as a mission of Waterloo by the late Bishop John Timon of Buffalo and was located in a former Methodist Church.

When the Diocese of Rochester was formed in 1868, St. James became a mission of Ithaca and finally in 1872 received its first resident pastor, Father Gilbert Nuonno.

The church was entirely rebuilt and dedicated in 1896 by the late Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid. Further improvements were made in the church during the ensuing years with Fathers T. J. Harrington, E. Joseph Esser, G. Stuart Hogan and Leonard A. Kelly as pastors.

Vienna — (NC) — Austria President Adolf Schaerf announced here that the Gold Medal for service to Austria has been awarded to Maria von Trapp, the head of the famous musical Trapp family which now lives in Vermont.

Mrs. Trapp, the widow of Baron George von Trapp, was born in Vienna in 1905. For a short time she was a novice in a Benedictine cloister in Salzburg, but she decided that she had no vocation for the life of a religious.

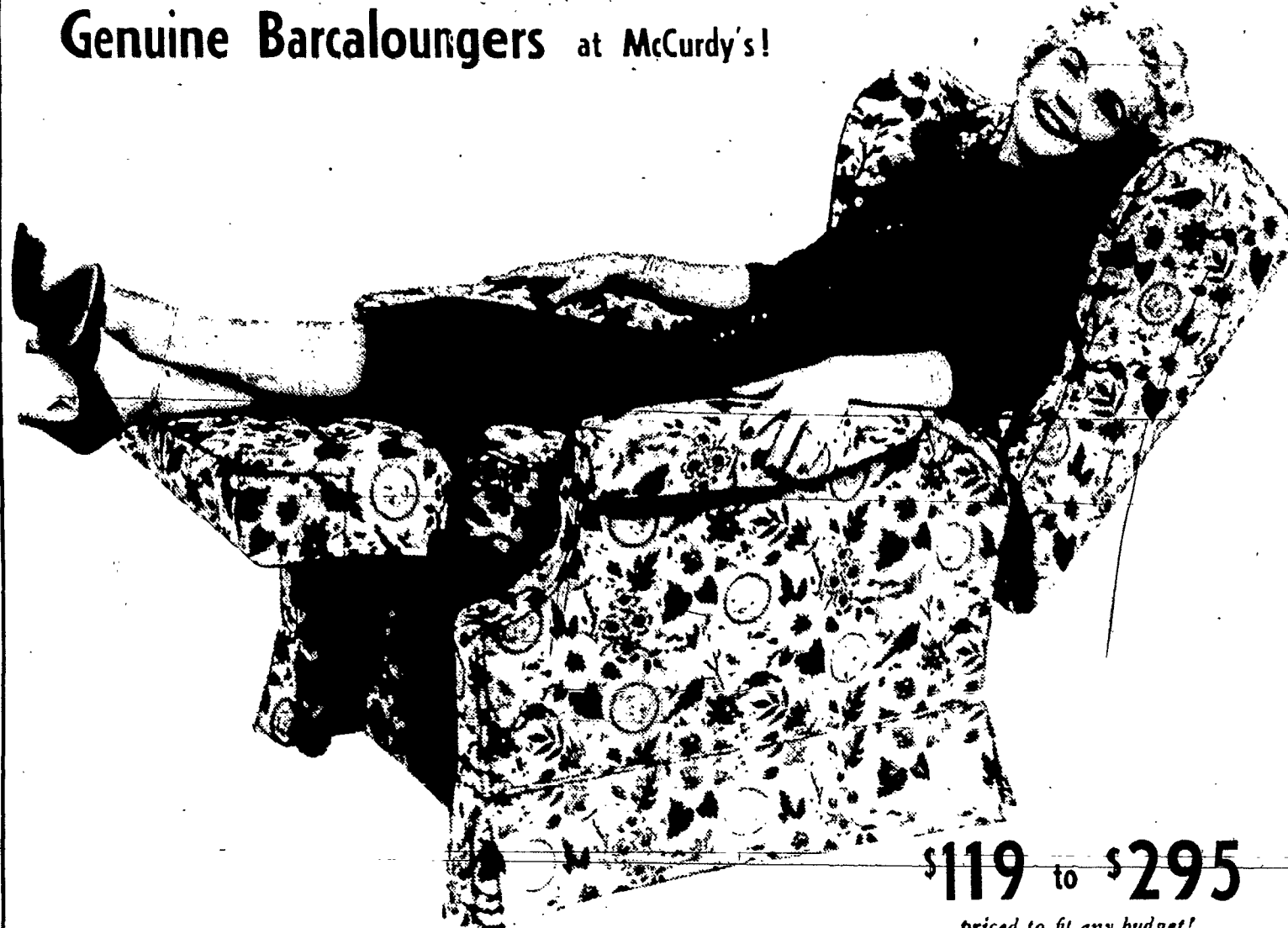
