Book Fair Listed 3 Days At Sacred Heart Academy

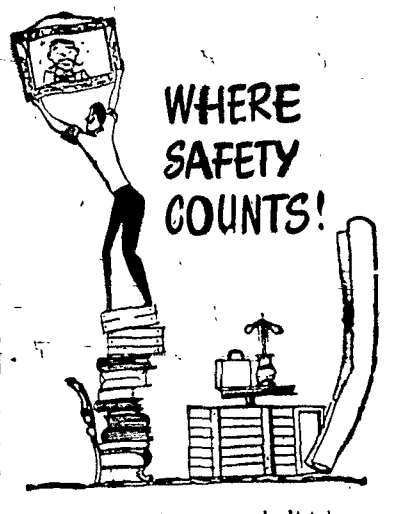

A disabled scooter owned by the Rev. Michael F. Kavanagh, S.J., native Rochesterian, doing missionary work in India, caused him to miss his congregation in an outlying station, he has written to his sister, here.
 Son of the late Michael Kavanagh, Knights of Columbus secretary for years, Father Kavanagh is stationed in Andhra, India. He wrote to his sister Mrs. James E. McMahon, 145 Hobart St., that his scooter has been laid up for more than three months.
 "Fr. Kavanagh A few one would cost \$400 and he has a little over half that amount."
 "THE OUT-MISSIONS cause him concern for transportation. The people at Purulia are particularly discouraged for each time I have promised to go to them, I have failed for one reason or another."
 "Last Sunday, for instance, after the Mass here (Adra) at 6:30 a.m. I got on a crowded hot bus and after two hours reached Purulia the people all had gone home thinking it was too late and I would never come."
 "Late that afternoon I got a ride back to Adra for the evening Mass there. However, the day was spoiled with nothing accomplished except when they find out I tried, they may not feel too bad."
 "FATHER KAVANAGH wrote that he has 1067 families on his welfare list for distributing rice from America. He tries to hold the number to 1000 families. "But always some pathetic case comes up and we say, 'Just one more'."
