**Priest-Historian Speaks  
On Princeton Controversy**

**Seneca Falls**—The Rev. Dr. Frederick J. Zwierlein of Rochester, noted author and the controversy at Princeton University in an address here.  
Dr. Zwierlein, professor emeritus of history at St. Bernard Seminary spoke to more than 100 members and guests of St. Patrick Guild and Altar Society at its 18th annual banquet in St. Patrick auditorium.

The facts concerning the action against the Dominican Father Hugh Halton, Catholic Chaplain at Princeton and director of Aquinas Institute there were related by the speaker. The stand of Father Halton and the support of his Bishop, the Most Rev. George W. Ahr were cited.  
**BISHOP AHR**, he said has the conviction that it is the right of a priest charged with the spiritual care of Catholic students in a secular university to speak out in defense of the faith and morals of those committed to his care.

Dr. Zwierlein declared that Walter T. Stace, a Princeton doctor, now retired and Professor George W. Elderkin, were both hostile in their religious beliefs, the latter "consistent in his attacks on the Catholic Church."

The Sisters operate Mercy Hospital, Auburn in the Diocese of Rochester.
