The other topic was "What can the Catholic Student bring to the university?" There are three ways in which a student may better a university. The first way is to show good example. The next is to maintain good grades. Thirdly a Catholic student can bring the Catholic faith back to the university where it once was.

The student may do this by clearing up many of the misbeliefs and misconceptions about the Catholic faith that many non-Catholics have, he said. Father Shannon closed the affair with a prayer.
