Divorce Termed 'Dry Rot' At Social Welfare Meet

Catholic social work experts this week played a leading part in sessions of the annual New York State Welfare Conference.

Speaking on "The greatest social problem facing America" Monsignor Irving A. DeBlanc, national director of the American Bishops' Family Life Bureau in Washington, termed divorce "a dry rot in our culture."

He said, "Next to the Moslems, Americans are the greatest failures in the world when it comes to divorce."

He also cited the increased number of abortions and illegitimate births. "The number of unwed mothers has gone up 400 per cent in ten years," he reported.

Monsignor DeBlanc urged churches, schools, and government agencies to promote "family focused" programs to help families stay together.

Another speaker, Monsignor John J. Lennon, dean of the social service school of the Catholic University at Washington, called for "more extended premarital and marital counseling and fuller preparation for the great profes- sion of marriage."

He stated that "urbanization" has undermined traditional family ties leaving family members free to go their separate ways. Parental influence is thereby weakened, said Monsignor Lennon and he warned that "nothing can supply the priceless blessing of an intelligent and conscientious training and example of parents."

He urged the social workers to support all "worth while efforts" to strengthen American home life.
