New Family Life Chairman Named At Cathedral

Appointment of a new chairman and reception of four new workers highlighted the meeting of the family life committee of the Rosary Guild of Sacred Heart Cathedral last week.

Mrs. Thomas Bristol, retiring chairman, is succeeded by Mrs. Maurice Gormican. His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey, spiritual director, paid tribute to Mrs. Bristol for her devotion to the cause of pre-school education.

During the three and one-half years of the committee's existence in Sacred Heart parish, 175 of these families have moved. Numerous families from other parishes, hearing of the service, have received complete tests on request.

The aim of the Committee, which is purely spiritual in nature, is to assist parents of the parish with the early religious training of their children.

At the time of baptism the parents are given a card telling of the work of the committee. The name of the child is turned over to the chairman and in turn she assigns the child to one of the workers in that family's immediate neighborhood.

Each of the 74 workers can be assigned up to ten babies.

This worker will call upon the parents at the time the child is three months old with the initial folder and first pamphlet.

Every three months for a period of three years she will call to deliver the additional leaflets. These pamphlets are designed primarily for parents in the home where all religious instruction should begin.

THEY CONTAIN ideas on how to initiate the religious education of pre-school children and emphasize that the home is the child's first school and the parents the first teachers.

At the semi-annual business meeting which was held in Sacred Heart Hall, Mrs. Bristol reported that 825 babies were enrolled since March of 1954 when this work began.

Currently 367 babies are receiving visits and over 5,000 leaflets have been delivered. Ninety

Consultant Named To Aid Hospital Expansion

Sister Margaret Adelaide, administrator of St. Joseph Hospital, Elmira, has announced the engagement of Anthony J. J. Rouke, M.D., of New Rochelle, as hospital consultant to assist the hospital in planning for its new wing.

Dr. Rouke has been in the hospital administrative field for 25 years. He served as assistant director at Columbus-Presbyterian Medical Center and University Hospital in Ann Arbor, and was physician superintendent of Stanford University Hospitals and professor of hospital administration at the Stanford University School of Medicine from 1940-1952.

He was executive director of the Hospital Council of Greater New York from 1952-1954, resigning this position to enter the full-time consulting field in July of 1951. He is past-president of the American Hospital Association.

DR. ROUKE will work with the hospital board, the medical staff, and hospital personnel in developing a long-range program for the hospital's expansion. In addition, he will work with the architect and the hospital in the detailed planning for the much needed addition.

Representatives of the board of directors and the executive committee met recently with Dr. Rouke during his visit to the hospital and unanimously recommended his employment. The shortage of land area for any addition, the increasing complexity of hospital operation, and the desire to secure the objective view of an experienced authority on hospital function led to the selection of Dr. Rouke.

Architects for the addition are Constine and Hassell of Elmira. Some of the funds for the addition are on hand as a result of the successful \$1,000,000 campaign finished earlier this year, and the hospital plans to move rapidly ahead with the program. Sister Margaret Adelaide reported.

In addition to work in many other states, Dr. Rouke has acted as consultant at Port Chester, Auburn, Sidney, Lockport, Poughkeepsie, Niagara Falls, Glens Falls, Syracuse and New York City.
