### Africa Bishops Hit Race Ban On Jobs

Cape Town, South Africa — (NC) — Two South African archbishops have declared that the principle of restricting certain kinds of jobs to whites is "unjust."

The condemnations came from Archbishop Owen McCann of Cape Town and Denis Hurley, O.M.I., of Durban, as the Nationalist government moved to extend its policy of strict race segregation further into the employment field.

The Archbishop deplored the announcement by South Africa's Minister of Labor, Sen. Jan de Klerk, that certain categories of work in the clothing industry are to be reserved for whites only. Archbishop Hurley labeled the action "so unjust as to be almost unbelievable."

Presentations were made by Attorney Joseph B. Hayes.

Explaining the meaning of symbols, Philip M. Sutton cited the two which stand out above the rest, the Cross of Christ and the flag of the United States of America.

"THE CROSS, he said, is the greatest of all symbols. It reminds us of the wonderful, never ending love that God has for us. It reminds us that Christ suffered and died on the cross for our sins. It reminds us that every day we agonize ourselves, but we are the greatest of all beings, that He made everything. Without God there would be nothing, no people, no sun, no moon, no world, no stars; just empty, dark, cold, silent space.

"The greatest among us are just little people, made by Him; to know Him is to love Him; to love Him is to love Him to be happy with Him in Heaven.

"Our flag is second in importance to the Cross because our country depends on God for its very existence. Our flag is the symbol of the ideals of our country and the people who founded it."
