Nearly 100 members of the special gifts committee for the Sisters of Mercy financial need appeal will make their final report at 8 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 12, in Our Lady of Mercy High School. Completion is expected by September, 1959.

Nearly 100 young Sisters are enrolled in the college, which provides teacher-training in preparation for service in diocesan schools. Provisionally chartered by the state, the college must have a more adequate building by 1959 in order to obtain a permanent charter. General solicitation among friends of the Sisters in Monroe County, as well as in other communities where the Sisters of Mercy teach, is slated from Jan. 10 to Jan. 30.

More than 600 members of the general committee in Monroe County, including representatives of Our Lady of Mercy High School graduation classes, will meet at 8 p.m. Monday, Dec. 14, in the high school.
