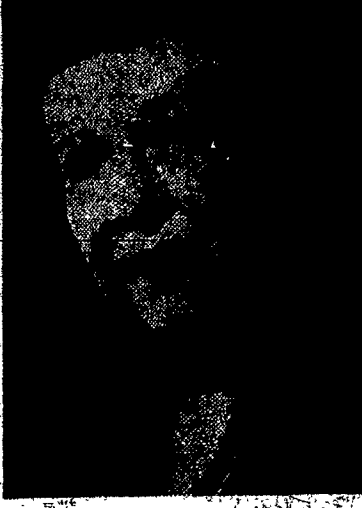
Mothers Club Plans Party
