**NEW MEDICAL BUILDING WILL COST 2 MILLION!**

Patrick Di Genaro and James H. Harrill, developers, have announced that the board of directors of the new Northside Professional Building, above, are to let bids for construction in January 1958 under the supervision of Bishop and Clark architects. The site is the west side of Portland Avenue next to the Northside General Hospital.

According to the developers, this new medical building is to take its place among the finest in the country. Planned to provide unexcelled convenience and facilities to both doctor and patient, the building will consist of two wings, each six stories in height with office space for approximately 100 physicians.

The outer walls of the structure will call for enameled curtain wall construction, fully insulated. Additional features included in the architects plans are: fully air-conditioned — all offices with outer exposure — solar absorbing windows — 24 hour telephone answering service. Correlated shops, such as: pharmacy, optician, and restaurant, will be situated off the spacious lobby.

Over 4 acres of free parking area will surround the building.

**FISHING CONTEST WINNERS NAMED**

The winners of the Twelfth Annual Louis A. Wehle Fishing Contest, which ended October 31, were announced this week.

Thirty-eight successful anglers split the Grand Prize money in the \$5,135.00 contest. Twelve of the winning entries were larger than the corresponding winners last year, topped by the "muskie" entry of Arthur Lawton, Delmar, New York, which weighed sixty-nine pounds, fifteen ounces, hooked in the St. Lawrence River off Clayton on September 22. This fish is not only a Wehle contest record, but according to all available information it is the largest "muskie" ever caught in the United States.

All three winners in the Brown Trout classification topped the big winner of 1956, while the two top grand prize winners in each of the Brook Trout, Lake Trout and Northern Pike groups beat last year's record. Paul Spivak of Elmira in the Rainbow Trout class and Alexander Dale of Middletown in the Pickering group, also bettered last year's score.

Four of the winning entries were caught by the so called "weaker sex" topped by the whopping "laker" taken by Mrs. John Oakes of Rochester in Hemlock Lake. It weighed an even twenty-four pounds.

The smallest winning entry was a two pound three ounce Rock Bass caught by Patsy Colletta of Albion in Sodus Bay. Consider this with the triple top for third place in the Perch group (at two pounds four ounces) and it proves once again that small fish win big prizes in the Annual Wehle Fishing Derby.

Louis A. Wehle, Chairman of the Board of The Genesee Brewing Co., Inc., of Rochester, sponsor of the annual event has mailed prize winning checks to the thirty-eight winners and at the same time announced that the Thirteenth Annual Contest will be launched April 1, 1958.

**Jenny Bowling Contest Lists \$12,000 Prizes**

New York State bowling teams will have a chance to make their prowess pay off during December, January and February by entering the \$12,000 Jenny Bowling Contest, sponsored by The Genesee Brewing Company of Rochester.

For the second year the "Jenny 5", captained by former Petersen Cup Champion Johnny Quinz, has issued a challenge to all five man teams competing in leagues sanctioned by the American Bowling Congress or the Women's International Bowling Congress.

The Jenny Bowling Contest is a handicap affair, open to all qualified teams, men and women, without entry fee.

After the three monthly contests in each section, the three winning teams will compete against "The Jenny 5" for the sectional championship. The "Jenny 5" will bowl from scratch, while all other teams will add their registered handicaps. Teams beating "The Jenny 5" will receive cash prizes of \$200; \$150; and \$100 respectively for first, second and third highest scores, and will be eligible to compete in the finals.

Finals will be held in Rochester on Saturday, April 26, 1958. All teams who have beaten "The Jenny 5" in the sectionals, and all sectional representatives, will be eligible to compete in a three game match against "The Jenny 5".

The team beating "The Jenny 5" will be the Contest New York State Champions and will be awarded a \$1000 cash prize. Second place team will receive \$500. Any other team beating "The Jenny 5" will receive \$200; and consolation prizes of \$100 will be presented to all losing teams.

Entry blanks and full details are available at bowling halls throughout the state. Judges are Edwin M. Wildey, vice president of the American Bowling Congress; Joseph J. Minella, president of the New York State Bowling Association and Mrs. Clove Bayley, secretary, New York State Women's Bowling Association.


