(3,155 lbs.), Our Lady of Lourdes (3,878 lbs.), Our Lady of Victory (200 lbs.), St. Philip Neri (2,187 lbs.), St. Anthony (1,067 lbs.), and Precious Blood (1,500 lbs.) in Rochester; St. John Evangelist, Greece (4,931 lbs.); St. Aloysius (3,336 lbs.) and Holy Family (3,336 lbs.) in Auburn; St. Patrick, Corning (1,876 lbs.), St. Mary, Danville (1,330 lbs.), and Assumption, Mt. Morris (750 lbs.).

OTHER PARISHES with increases are those in Brockport (1,850 lbs.), Hilton (2,150 lbs.), Horseheads (1,500 lbs.), King Ferry-Ludlowville (1,076 lbs.), L. L. Conroy (1,266 lbs.), L. E. Vorcia Center - Honeyey (1,337 lbs.), Marlon (338 lbs.), Moravia (793 lbs.), Nunda-Croftland (358 lbs.), Penfield (2,112 lbs.), Perkinsville (970 lbs.), Seneca Falls (4,060 lbs.), West Webster (3,474 lbs.), and Geneseo (1,440 lbs.).
