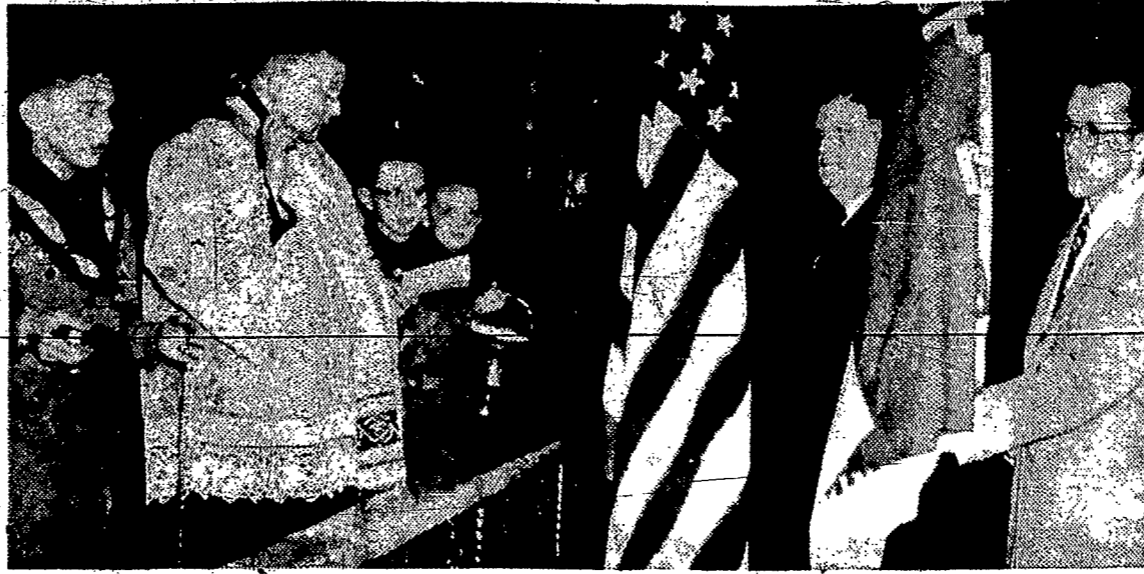
New directors elected to serve for three years were Mrs. Theodore A. Busch, Mrs. James O'Donnell and Joseph J. Rybarczyk.
