The Cardinal spoke at the installation of Father Jacques Hollande, former head of the Mission of Paris — the name of the so-called priest-workers group — as pastor of the Parisian parish of Holy Trinity.

Pope Acclaims Lourdes Jubilee

Lille, France — (RNS) — Pope Pius XII sent a message to Cardinal Liernart, Bishop of Lille, expressing his keen interest in the success of the centennial celebrations at Lourdes in 1958.

"We have great hopes for this Marian Year," the Pope told the prelate who is the senior cardinal of the Church in France.

The jubilee year, beginning next Feb. 11, marks the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Lourdes to Bernadette Soubirous at the grotto of Massabieulle, Bernadette, a French peasant girl, was canonized in 1933.

During the year a number of major celebrations will take place. The principal dates will be

March 25, the day on which the "Lady" announced, "I am the Immaculate Conception," and July 16, the date of the last of the 18 apparitions.

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Faces Are Red Because Map Is Blue

Kaskaskia, Ill.—(NC)—The Belleville diocese in Illinois temporarily "lost" one of its oldest parishes when Missouri cartographers erred in coloring a new map for publication by the state highway department.

The so-called "priest-worker" movement began in 1954 when a group of young Parisian priests under Father Henri Godin founded the Mission of Paris with the permission of Cardinal Suhard. Concerned about the large numbers of French workers who had become ignorant of the teachings of the Church and had given up the practice of Christianity under the influence of communism.

"Of course, this work ran into difficulties. There was misunderstanding in many quarters, even among the faithful. Difficulties increased when the Church thought it wise to reorient the movement, to correct certain methods then in use and finally to call a halt to certain aspects of this activity.

"Even this final gesture of the Church was badly interpreted. Some claimed that the Church had abandoned the worker. But this is a profound error! The Church will never cease to seek out the perfect way to place the priest among the workers."

But red-faced mapmakers admitted their mistake when the first official maps went into circulation.

Kaskaskia, site of historic Immaculate Conception parish, whose origin dates back to the days of Pere Marquette, stands on an island in the Mississippi River. The main channel is now east of the island, although the territory always has been part of the state of Illinois.

In coloring the map, cartographers made the island bluish white, conforming to the expanse of the state of Missouri. The error will be corrected in the next map to be issued in April, 1958.

Father Marquette founded the original mission of the Immaculate Conception 234 years ago on the upper reaches of the Illinois River, near Utica and Starved Rock.
