Monsignor John E. Maney will lead a pilgrimage to

The pilgrimage will include vists to Europe's famous shrines and scenic spots.

The group will be the official diocesan pilgrimage for the Lourdes centennial observance. Monsigner Maney plans to celebrate Mass at the grotto altar where Our Lady appeared in 1858 to the peasan girl St. Bernadette Soublrous.

This will be the monsignor's lifth trip to Europe, besides his four year course of studies at Rome's North American College prior to his ordination as a priest.

He offered his first Mass as a newly ordained priest at the crypt altar near the tomb of the Prince of the Apostles in the vast St. Peter's Vatican Basilica. He will return this year to offer Mass at the same altar almost nineteen years since his first Mass there in 1939.
