Hospital Surgeon Opens Office In Newark

Newark After four and a half years studying surgery in St. Mary Hospital, Rochester, Dr. Edward J. Diamond, a specialist in general surgery opened an office at 129 West Miller St. Born in Scotland, Dr. Diamond was educated there and interned at United Hospital at Port Chester, N.Y.

Dr. Diamond whose practice is restricted to surgery, is a member of the Newark Wayne Community Hospital staff with surgical privileges and is a member of the Lyons Hospital staff. In the United States from 1942 to 1943, the new Newark surgeon was assigned by the Royal Air Force to a British Flying school in Texas. He was a Spitfire pilot from 1942 to 1945. He held the rank of sergeant in the air force and was transferred to the Fleet Air Arm Command. After V E Day he was a first lieutenant in the Navy as a combat pilot on a carrier.

Dr. and Mrs. Diamond became American citizens in Rochester naturalization ceremonies last month and have a son, Peter, 9 months.
