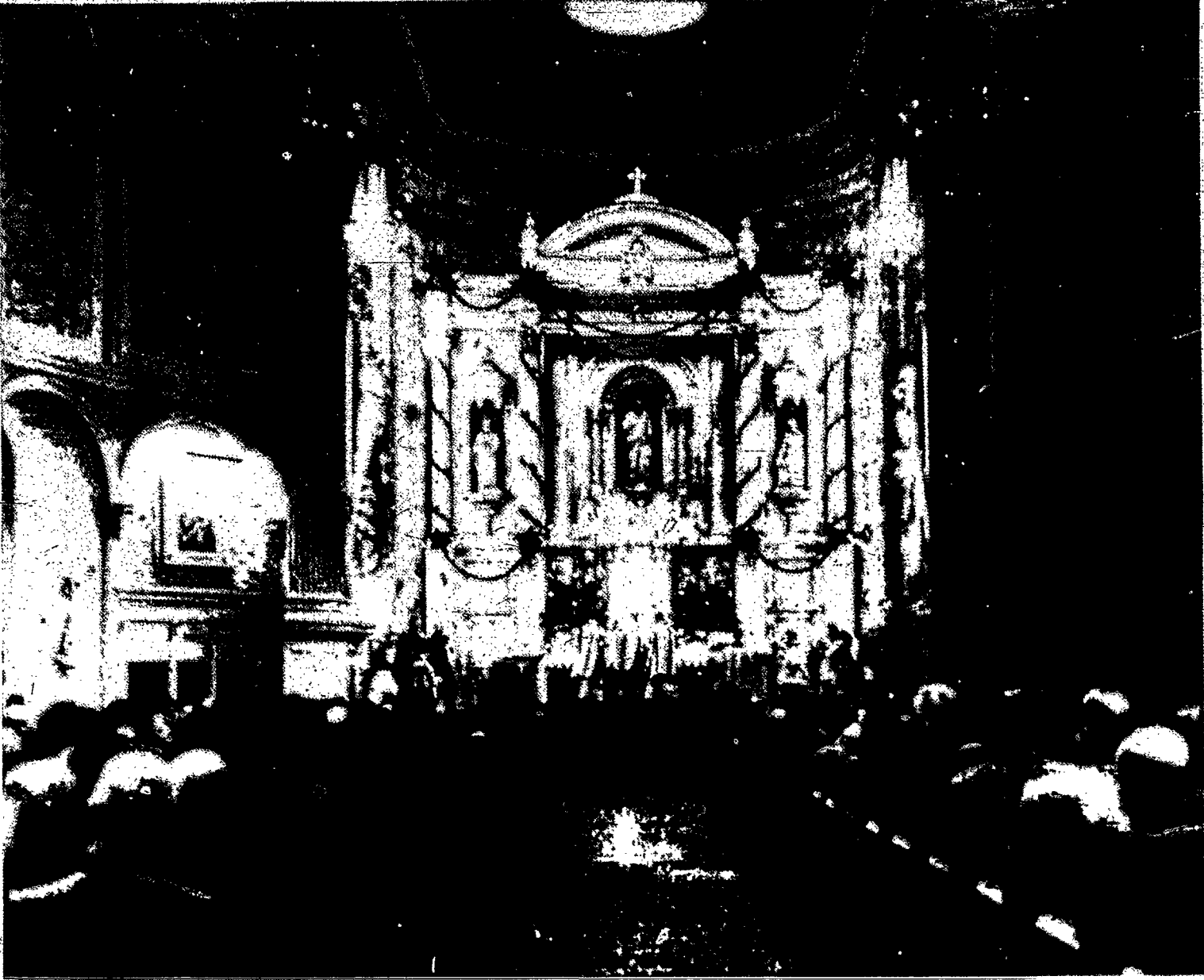

Through Health Group

Three films were added to the Visiting Nurse and Health Association film library and are available to any Chemung County group. One is on tuberculosis and the other two are on the heart.

"ARE YOU POSITIVE?" A 13 1/2 minute, color film was produced to point out and explore many misunderstandings about tuberculosis. It gives the latest facts about discovery, incidence and treatment of the disease.

"HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE" — 7 minutes — color, live photography, diagrams and animated drawings explain briefly the facts about high blood pressure. The narrator makes it clear that only a doctor can tell if high blood pressure is a serious condition and what treatment if any is required.

"CORONARY HEART DISEASE" — 6 minutes — color, live photography, animated drawings, and diagrams illustrate the structure of the coronary arteries, how they nourish the heart and what happens when a heart attack occurs.
