

Priory Status Granted Mt. Saviour Monastery

Status of Mount Saviour Monastery, Elmira was raised to that of a Conventual Priory and the Very Rev. Damasus Winzen was appointed first Conventual Prior, according to word from Rome.

The decision marking the end of the first or "foundation" stage of the Benedictine monastery, was made by the Sacred Congregation of Religious, Vatican office handling matters pertaining to religious orders.

Mount Saviour becomes an independent member of the Confederation of Benedictine Abbeys throughout the world.

THIS OPENS the way for the next step, that of being raised to an abbey, in the monastery's development. This will take place

when the monastery has met the necessary requirements consisting of a minimum number of 12 solemnly professed monks and the buildings which will enable the community to live the monastic life in full accordance with St. Benedict's Rule.

Necessary funds are expected through a campaign now being formulated to permit resumption of building of the monastic enclosure as originally planned, it was announced at Mount Saviour.

Since completing the first stage in the building plans in 1952, the Chapel of Our Lady, Queen of Peace, it was necessary to attend to the essential living requirements and postpone any further development in the original plans.

Mt. Saviour was founded in the spring of 1951, in the hills between Elmira and Corning. Father Damasus Winzen, the Prior, was the monastery founder and has been the temporary superior up to now.

His appointment as a Conventual Prior makes him permanent superior of the monastery and gives him the privilege of attending the congress of abbots held in Rome every six years.
