Bp. Casey Cites Need For College

Accomplishments of the Sisters of Mercy in the Rochester Diocese during the last 100 years will find generous appreciation in their current financial need appeal, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey said Monday night at a meeting in Mercy High School Auditorium.

Principal speaker at the kickoff rally for the appeal committee, Bishop Casey told the more than 600 committee men and women that the labors, sacrifices and accomplishments of the Sisters of Mercy have written a very important chapter in the history of the diocese.

INAUGURATED AT the meeting was a solicitation among Friends of the Sisters for pledges toward construction of a new

Bishop Casey justified the appeal on at least three counts:

1. This is the first time in 100 years that they have asked their friends for direct financial assistance. They have contributed untold benefits to the community through their dedication to education and other services.

2. The present college facility, conducted in the basement of the

motherhouse, adds to the overcrowded conditions in the building where there is insufficient accommodation for adequate quarters for the Sisters reception of new postulants, and provision for retired and aging Sisters.

New facilities for the college have been mandated by state education authorities. Now operated under a provisional charter, the college must have better facilities by 1959 in order to gain a permanent state charter. By conducting their own Sister-teacher training, the Sisters are better able, at less cost, to provide professionally equipped teachers to meet the growing de-

mands of the diocese.

OTHER SPEAKERS included the Rev. Richard T. Torney, chairman of the Mercy Sisters, who described the appeal as "an investment in the future of several generations," and Mother Mary Magdalene, mother general of the Sisters' community, who thanked all present for their efforts on behalf of vocations and education.
