Sister Mary Casimir during 12 years salvaged all the old newspapers and magazines which she could find around the hospital and sold them. As a result she accumulated more than \$1,200. enough to purchase the six-figure shrine for the grotto. The figures include The Blessed Mother and the three Portuguese children to whom she appeared at Fatima, Portugal, in 1917 while they were tending sheep.
