

Unity Octave Anniversary To Be Marked On Radio

The Very Rev. Francis J. Connell, C.S.S.R., dean of the School of Sacred Theology at Catholic University of America, will speak on CBS Radio's "Church of the Air" Sunday, Jan. 19 as the program observes the 50th anniversary of the Chair of Unity Octave.



The broadcast will be heard on Station WHCC 1460, from 11 to 11:30 p.m. Father Connell will speak of "The Unity Octave" in his sermon.

The Unity Octave was inaugurated in 1908 by Father Paul Francis, founder of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement at Garrison, N. Y. Father Paul was an Episcopal Clergyman when he proposed the Unity Octave. Two years later became a convert and a Catholic priest.

Former City Woman Produces Drama On Jesuit Survivor Of Hiroshima

New York — (RNS) — Hiroshima, a play based on the experience of a Jesuit priest who survived the 1945 atom bombing of the Japanese city, has been completed by Mary Productions.

Mary Productions is a husband and wife team. Since 1947 Mary Eurlce (Sayrader) and Joseph Spagnola have been devoting themselves to writing and distributing royalty-free plays dedicated to "the message of Mary—truth and goodness."

A native Rochesterian and convert to the Catholic Faith, Mrs. Spagnola (the former Mary Eurlce Sayrader) is well known in local theatrical circles. As actress-playwright and director, she has been identified with her husband in promoting the work of Mary Productions, a non-profit dramatic organization founded by her and her husband.

Central figure for the play is the Rev. Hubert Schiffer, S.J., German Missionary who was eight blocks from "zero zone" where the bomb hit.

the open street "is hardly likely I would have survived." FATHER SCHIFFER said that he and three other priests in the rectory were "picked up and smashed against the opposite wall." Except for what they could-render to one another they were without aid for 12 hours. "The bomb caused suffocating heat," he said, which continued without abatement as the wooden structures of Hiroshima went up in flames that raged for hours.

"I had been through many bombings at Tokyo," he continued, "and of course we were prepared for an ordinary bombing. But the atom bomb was so devastating we could not even reach first aid kits. For a long time we just lay where we fell. Then we revived enough to tear up our shirts, cassocks and the bed linen to make bandages. We were all bleeding profusely. Much later still, after we had received some help we used razor blades to cut out thousands of glass splinters imbedded in our skin."

"There were no hospitals left," he said. "Besides there were the people to be helped. That thought was always in one's mind."

Father Schiffer, who was the youngest of the injured priests, said that as soon as he could "crawl" he went to a small nearby park which was not expected to burn because it was fresh and green. Two thousand people had taken refuge there and the priest went among them giving what help he could. But he learned later that only 70 survived.

Of the priests who were bombed with him, Father Schiffer said one has been in the hospital ever since and the others "up and down." He himself has "an unfavorable bloodcount which may be due to radiation."

Mary Productions was founded by the Spagnolas in 1947. Present headquarters are in Belford, N.J. Mary Production plays have been produced by school and drama groups in Ireland, England, Australia, Japan, South America, India, the Gold Coast of Africa as well as all parts of the United States.
