

Rare Views Of Pope On TV

'Rome Eternal'

New York — (NC) — A filmed portrait of modern Rome, Vatican City and His Holiness Pope Pius XII will be shown as the final installment of "Rome Eternal" on the Catholic Hour on Jan. 26.

Entitled "Our Moment in Time," the film will be seen on WROC-TV, Channel 5 in Rochester at 1:30 p.m. Depicted will be rare views of the Pope during and following audiences at St. Peter's Basilica and at his summer residence, Castelgandolfo.

Other highlights of the film will include the grandeur of St. Peter's Square and Basilica, the North American College in Rome, the Pope's apartments and the Vatican mosaic factory and radio station.

"Rome Eternal," a four-part film series, was co-produced by the National Council of Catholic Men and the National Broadcasting Company.

Patrol Leaders Aid Police Safety Work

Alert school safety patrol leaders are the unsung heroes in the Rochester Police Department's crusade against traffic accidents. These boys and girls daily guide more than 50,000 pupils from parochial and public schools through the hazards of crosswalks.

Against the mounting toll of pedestrian accidents, school safety leaders boast an enviable record of no children injured in a school area during the past year.

THE PATROL leaders are chosen by school authorities and are under the supervision of Inspector Albert O. Daniels of the Rochester Police Bureau. The youngsters are posted within the school and at crosswalks to supervise the safety and conduct of their fellow students.

Similar programs are carried on in areas throughout the Diocese.

AMONG THE rules which the patrol maintains are: no running, no pushing, keep in single file, keep moving and no snowballing.

The task of patrol leaders is a difficult one, especially in these brisk winter winds. "I'd sure like to sleep a half hour longer in this weather," one boy said.

But that extra sleep is out of the question for these youngsters

who must be at their posts by 8:30 each morning. They again take their posts from 11:15 to noon, and from 12:30 to 1 p.m.

"Sometimes it's tough to see the other kids playing in the school yard at noon, when we have to stay on duty," said one patrol leader. At the close of school in the afternoon the patrol spends another 45 minutes on duty.

THE REWARDS for school patrol leaders are few, but deserving. Once each year the youngsters are entertained at a theatre party and in the summer they are guests at an outing at Sea Breeze park where everything is "on the house."

Also at the final assembly of the school year, the patrol members are given certificates of award for the number of hours they spend on duty.

"If it wasn't for these boys and girls, God forbid what might happen at school crossings," Officer Harvey Kusse of the Rochester Police Bureau stated. "They are doing a terrific job. You just can't measure in dollars and cents what these children have accomplished."
