## Youth Warned:

## 'Wallflower Faith' Failing Church

St. Louis, Mo. — RNS — Young Catholics who fail to contribute to the support of their parish churches were censured here by the assistant director of the Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Youth.

The Rev. Louisa F. Meyer told a young adult group affiliated with the council that many young men who are earning as much if not more than their fathers' make no financial contribution to the churches they attend.

"All too often a parish priest will not see or hear from his young parishioners until they show up to make marriage arrangements," Father Meyer said. "This does not mean that they are not attending church and obeying the Commandments. It does mean that they are not taking part in the life of the parish."

The priest added that failure to participate in the financial, religious, cultural and social life of a parish produces "wallflower Catholics."

Such persons, he said, are "unable to explain or defend Catholicism in the face of questions or attacks. They 'become of value' he declared, "only when they begin to cooperate and act through the parish."

Unions are the operative agencies in our society for protecting worker rights, which have been defined by the popes.

The popes, recognizing the complexity of economic civilization today, have repeatedly urged workers to organize and not to be deluded by the error of individualism.

In the vast majority of industries, strong, stable unions are absolutely necessary to protect workers and their families from cruel exploitation.

In fact, many industrialists have been convinced by the logic of events that industry itself is in danger without strong unions.

The very name of the "right to work" laws is designed to deceive — to distract attention from realities which make unions necessary.

UNDER UNION-SHOP agreements, an employer may hire anyone. Within a given time the new employee is required to join the union — precisely as he is required to pay social security.

Right to work laws destroy the union-shop arrangement. Workers are left free to join the union or not. This encourages the wicked old practice of ...
