Registration For Boys, Girls Slated At Diocesan Camp Office For '58 Season

Registration of boys and girls for Camp Stella Maris will be open Saturday, Feb. 1, the Camp Office announced today. The 1958 season will mark the 22d year for the diocesan camp, now one of the largest residential Catholic camps in New York State.

This summer Camp Stella Maris is prepared to accommodate a capacity enrollment of 140 boys for 2 one week and 2 two week encampments and 140 girls for a two week and a one week encampment. Last summer 812 boys and girls of elementary school age, enjoying camping on this beautiful site on Corvus Lake. This summer camp officials expect at least 840 campers.

SEMINARIANS are counselors for the boys with a ratio of one counselor for every six boys. Mr. Roger Switzer, of St. Bernard's Seminary will be Head Counselor for the Boys Staff, assisted by Mr. Gerald Appleby.

For the Girls Staff, the Director will be Miss Maria M. Adam, of Our Lady of Lourdes Faculty, assisted by Miss Mary Burkett, of Our Lady of Mercy High School Faculty.

Rev. Eugene H. McFarland is Executive Director and Resident. The Sisters of Mercy will begin their 12th summer at camp where they are in charge of the kitchen and infirmary.

REGISTRATION will not be open to children outside the Diocese of Rochester until March 15, 1958.

The total fee for two weeks is \$65.00. The total fee for one week is \$35.00. Of this total fee, a

registration fee of \$5.00 is due at the time the child is registered and the remainder is due June 1, 1958.

Chemung Unit Gives \$2000 To Hospital

A donation of \$2,000.00 was made to St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira by Chemung County Cerebral Palsy and Handicapped Children's Association.

The money was part of a building fund raised by the association. However, with discontinuance of its clinic last year, the funds no longer were needed for that purpose.

The gift was presented to Sister Margaret Adelaide Administrator by Harry T. Richardson, association president and Mrs. Howard P. Barber, a director of that organization.

THE DONATION is for restorative and may be used as the administrator sees fit. It is planned to be used for equipment and attached to the hospital as a playground. It was purchased with the association's gift.

The association formerly operated by Dr. A. M. Stuart, Chairman of the Board, which was discontinued last month because the need for its services had diminished.

Most of the work done by the Chemung Unit is being handled by physical therapists in public schools and hospital physical therapy facilities.

The money was raised through subscription for a building to house the clinic, but as other agencies took over this work it was determined that the building program was not needed.

It was decided to turn over the funds to St. Joseph's and the Anne Ogden Memorial Hospital, the latter institution having received a like sum.

St. Boniface To Build New Church

St. Boniface parish is going to have a new church. The new edifice will replace the parish's 30-year-old Gothic church ravaged by fire on last Nov. 6.

"It would cost over \$500,000, maybe as much as a million dollars to rebuild the old church," said Father Walter Kohl, pastor of the Gregory St. parish.

"We had the best engineers and architects in the area survey the damage done by the fire," he said, "and they all agreed it would be unwise and unsafe to try to repair the shell that we see out there now."

"Bishop Kearney told me to have an architect draw up plans for a new church with a seating capacity of about 700 people," the pastor revealed.

"That is just the size church our parish needs," he said. "There are about 2000 people coming to Masses here on Sundays so the 700 capacity will take care of our needs very nicely."

The new church will probably cost about \$425,000, he stated.

"That's about what churches the size we plan to build cost these days. But that amount will vary depending on style and furnishings and many other factors," Father Kohl said.
