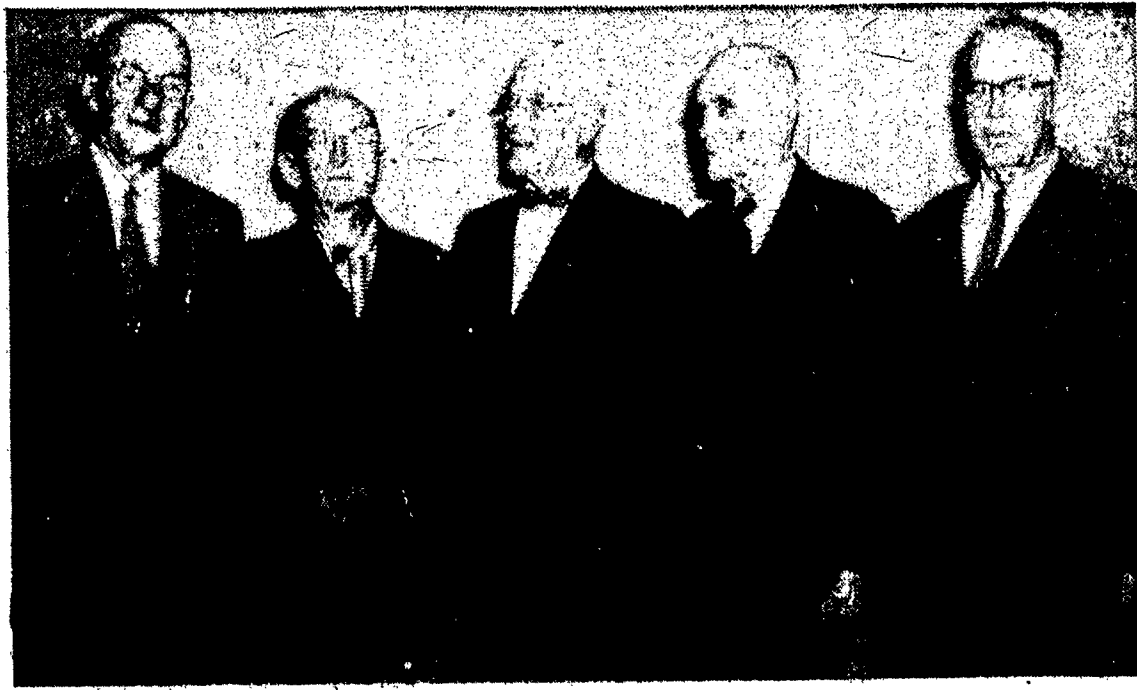

As beggars for the Holy Father and his Missions we know this to be true, as this letter from a child of seven bears witness:

Dear Bishop Sheen: Mother went to the hospital for the second time in two weeks. Daddy does not come home very often. Once when he did, he kicked Mommy out of the house and she had to go to the hospital. Daddy is not kind but bitter, and he treats her like dirt and makes her feel bad. She cries and my brother and sister cry too. Mommy always tells us to be kind and to love him, to pray for him and never blame him, that God will keep him from sin and wickedness and save his soul. Will you please pray for us? I am sending you twenty five cents from myself and three cents from my sister. Give it to the Holy Father because we know that he gives the money to the missionaries. God bless you and keep you. Frances.

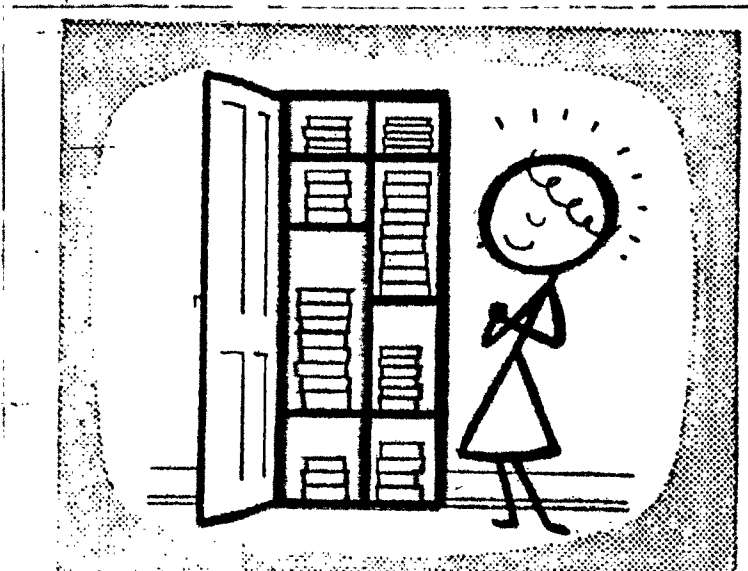

Pope Designates Fr. Muckle Church As Lourdes Shrine

Toronto, Ont. — (RNS) — Pope Pius XII has approved the designation of Our Lady of Lourdes church here as a local shrine of prayer during the Lourdes Marian year. Cardinal McGulgan, Archbishop of Toronto, announced.

Cardinal McGulgan said the Pontiff had granted a plenary indulgence to every person who visits the shrine on any or all Feasts of the Virgin Mary during the year under the usual conditions. The same indulgence is granted to all groups of eight or more who visit the shrine under the same conditions on any day.

The Rev. W. D. Muckle, pastor of Toronto's "Little Lourdes" who also is celebrating his 40th anniversary of ordination, expects thousands of pilgrims from all over the archdiocese and outside it.

Father Muckle has two brothers who are priests in the Diocese of Rochester, the Rev. John F. Muckle, pastor emeritus of St. Thomas Church, and the Rev. Charles E. Muckle, pastor of St. Agnes Church, Avon. Another brother, the Rev. Joseph Muckle, C.S.B. in Toronto. A sister, Sister Mary Charles is a member of the Rochester diocese Sisters of Mercy.
