Vatican City (RNS)—The Vatican Radio has inaugurated a series of foreign language broadcasts of religious dramas.
The new broadcasts are in addition to the station's regular religious news bulletins and comments on world affairs. It recently started broadcasts by scientists designed to "clear away" apparent, but unfounded, differences between scientific and religious conceptions of the world.
